# INTRODUCTION TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY



"Information is obtained through Processing of data"

Information Is A Vital Resource In Development Activities Of Any Society. All Our Economic And Social Progress Depends Significantly On The Transfer Of Commercial, Scientific And Technical Information, People In Different Situations Require Information On A Subject In Different Forms And With Different Emphasis.



## GENERATION OF COMPUTERS

Now in order to have these three features, i.e., perform logical functions, perform repetitive functions and store data and instruction (Memory) in a computer, certain components were made use of, which made a lot of difference in the capacity of the computer. So depending on the technology in use, the computers are said to belong to different generations.



### I<sup>ST</sup> GENERATIONS COMPUTERS (1945 - 1955) :-

The main components in use were the vacuum tubes (like those in the old radios). This warmed up after a minute or so and glowed red). The vacuum tubes were also called as valves. The first computer used 17000 vacuum tubes, weighed 30 tons and occupied an area of a big hall. Vacuum tubes or valves took ages to warm up and consumed massive amounts of electricity. Some of the computers of this generation are ENIAC, UNIVAC-1.



### II<sup>ND</sup> GENERATION COMPUTERS (1955 - 1965):-

The real breakthrough in computers started with the discovery of the transistor (one can find 3 legged component inside all transistors/radios). Transistor is a tiny semi-conductor device; the size is about 1/50th of a Valve which can perform the same function as that of a large valve. Transistor replaced valves in computers. The use of transistors has:

1. Reduced the size of computer.
2. Reduced manufacturing and running costs.
3. Improved reliability and processing power of the computer.

Computer which were built using transistors became the Second Generation Computers. Some of the computers of this generation are: IBM 7000 SERIES. IBM 1620 1401. The Second Generation computers were significantly faster than the first generation computer but things did not stop there.



### III<sup>RD</sup> GENERATION COMPUTERS (1965 - 1970):-

In the next step, functions of a number of transistors were put together on a single chip (wafer) of silicon. These chips are called Integrated Circuit (IC) chips. A small chip, the size of a finger nail could have the equivalent of 200 to 2000 transistors.

The chip is a small silicon wafer with very minute transistors, which can do logical comparisons and calculations. Some chips have been developed for the purpose of data storage. These constitute the memory chip. The use of chip technology reduced the size of computers. Computers, which were built using ICs, became the Third Generation Computers. Some of the computers of this generation are: IBM 360. IBM 370.

#### **IV<sup>TH</sup> GENERATION COMPUTERS (1970 onwards):-**

From 1970 onwards, we are in the era of Fourth Generation Computers, in which the electronic component was further miniaturized through Large Scale Integration (LSI) of circuits on the silicon chip. Now the advancement of chip technology has come to be known as Very Large Scale Intergration (VLSI), where millions of transistors are packed in a single chip. The VLSI chips are getting refined every day. The size of the chip is shrinking and the components which are packed in a chip are multiplying. As a result, the size of the computer is reducing. What used to be a room-sized computer at one time is now available as Desktop computer or Lap-top computer with much more computational power. Along with the reduction in size, there is significant reduction in prices, too.

#### **V<sup>TH</sup> GENERATION COMPUTERS:-**

From 1982 onwards, research is on to develop a Fifth Generation computer that will have the thinking power just like that of the human brain. These computers which are based on Artificial Intelligence (AI) are designed to be "Thinking computers" capable of storing large amount of data to be retrieved as and when required solving a problem.

#### **TYPES OF COMPUTERS:-**

There are different types of computer depending on the function they perform.

**Analog Computers:** A computer which measures continuously changing conditions, such as temperature and pressure, and converts them into quantities. These computers are used in scientific and engineering fields.

**Digital Computers:** A computer which measures digital data and perform arithmetic and logical operations on such data. These are the most popularly used computers.

**Hybrid Computers:** Computer system that combine features of both analog and digital computers.

**WEB PAGE** : A Page Written In HTML That Available On The Internet Through The HTTP Protocol.

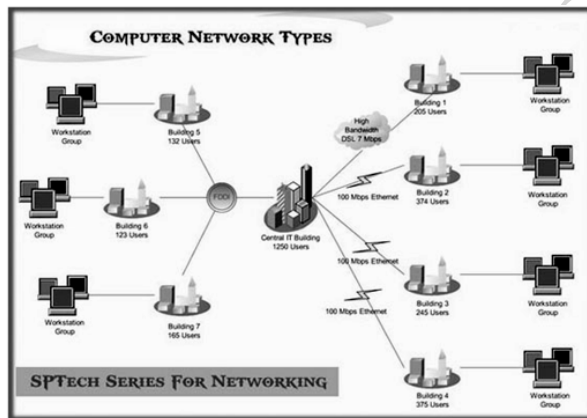
**WEB SITE** : A Site Written Consisting Of Venous Web Page That A Be Accessed By Anyone Connected To The Internet.

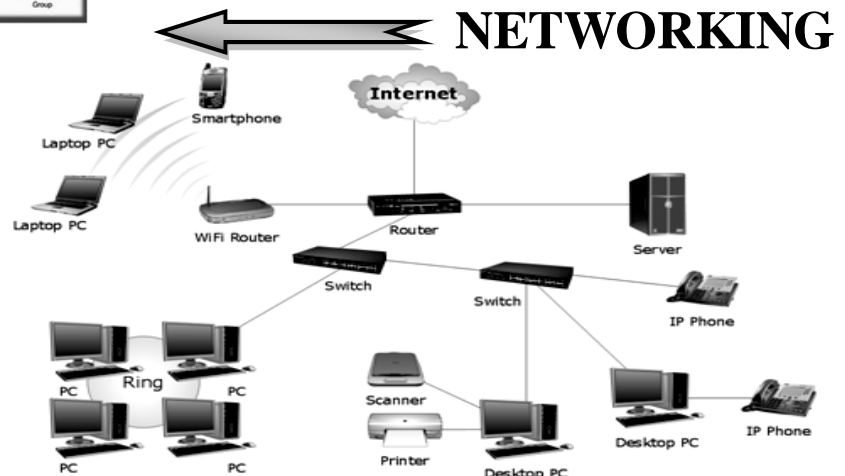

- 3. Metropolitan Area Network:** Metropolitan Area Network Is Where We Join A Computer Of A Particular City Together.



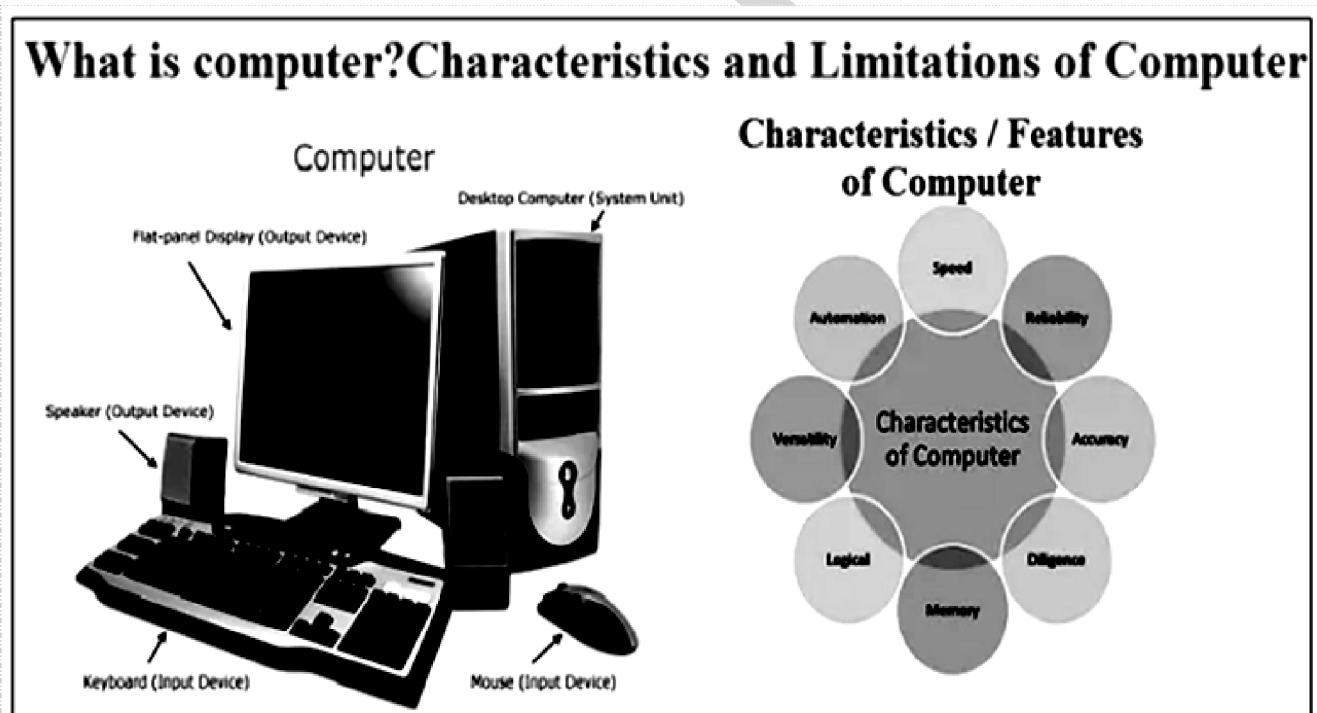
# 02 INTRODUCTION OF COMPUTER

Speed, Accuracy, Versatile, Storage, Secrecy Are The Main Characteristics Of Computer.

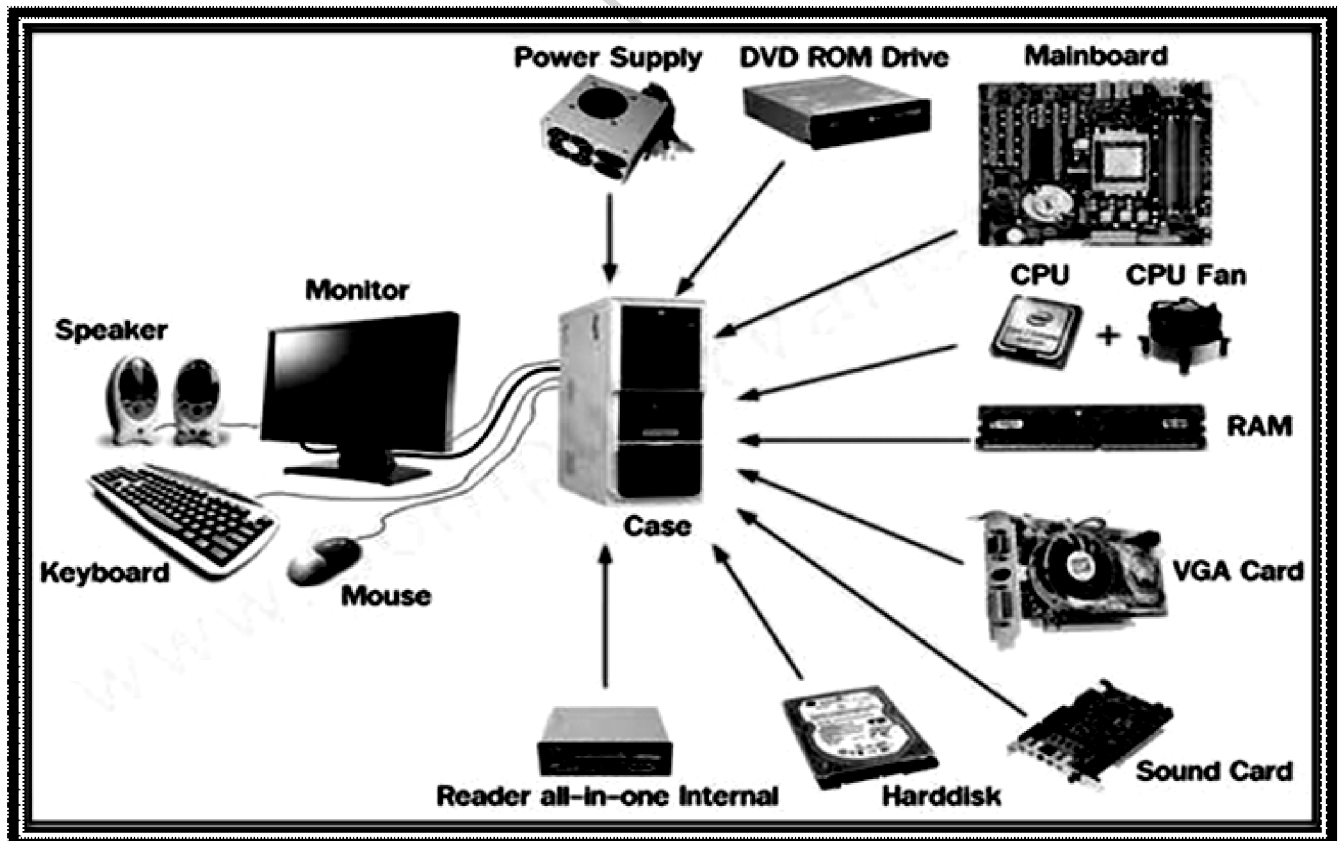

**VDU (Visual Display Unit):-** The most popular output device is the Visual Display Unit (VDU), also sometime referred to as a Monitor. The most popular output device in the form that we can understand. The viewing surface of a typical VDU is equal to that of a 12 or 14 inch TV. The VDU output is referred to as a soft-copy output. Most of the monitor can display 25 lines of text with 80 characters in each line. Most of te VDUs seen today use a cathode ray tube (CRT) whereas, there are some monitors which use liquid crystal display (LCD).

VDUs can display in single colour (monochrome) or in many colour(colour). The mode of display can be either text or graphic. This visual display screen s divided into rows and column of tiny dots, squares or cells, each of which is a picture element or pixel. A pixel is the smallest element to create pictures and text in different formats (styles). A collection of pixel will be used to represent a character or a picture.

A screen capable of displaying large number of pixels is capable of a high resolution or graphic resolution screen. The high resolution screen is capable of displaying sharp images.

## INTRODUCTION OF HARDWARE

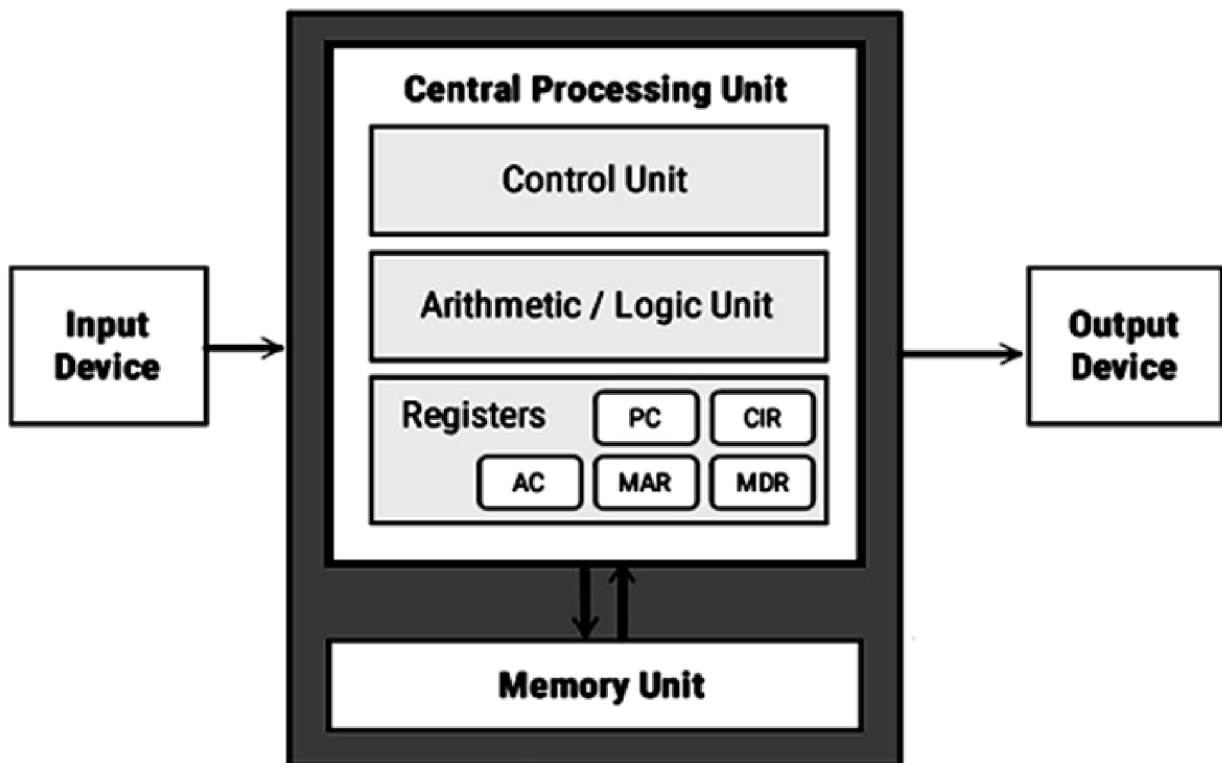


**CPU:-** Central Processing Unit is the heart of any computer system. It consists of primary memory unit, arithmetic logic unit and control unit.

**“CPU is called the heart of Computer”**

**CONTROL UNIT(CU):-** Control Unit Controls all the hardware operations. Input output units, storage and have the processor itself.

**ARITHMETIC LOGIC UNIT (ALU):-** The arithmetic and logic unit in computer are capable of performing addition, Subtraction, division and multiplication as well as some logical operation.



**MEMORY:-** The memory unit is an essential component in any digital computer since it is needed for storing the programs that are executed by the CPU.

The memory unit that communicates directly with the CPU is called the main memory and devices that provide backup storage and called auxiliary memory device only programs and data currently used by the processor reside the main memory. Memory can be divided in two Primary Memory and Secondary Memory.

## THE PRIMARY MEMORY ALSO HAS TWO PARTS:

**RAM** (Random Access Memory)—Dynamic Ram, Static Ram

**ROM** (Read Only Memory)

“Primary Memory is the temporary memory where as Secondary Memory is the Permanent Memory”.

The Secondary memory is the memory is the memory, which is found outside computer system. A Large quantity of Data can be stored permanently on it.

Secondary devices like floppy disk, hard Disk, CD.

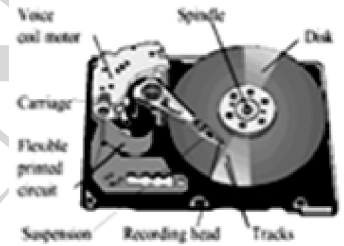
**USB PEN DRIVE :-** USB pen Drive is a small key ring sized Device that can be use to easily transfer files between USB computable systems.

We see a series of menu commands such as :

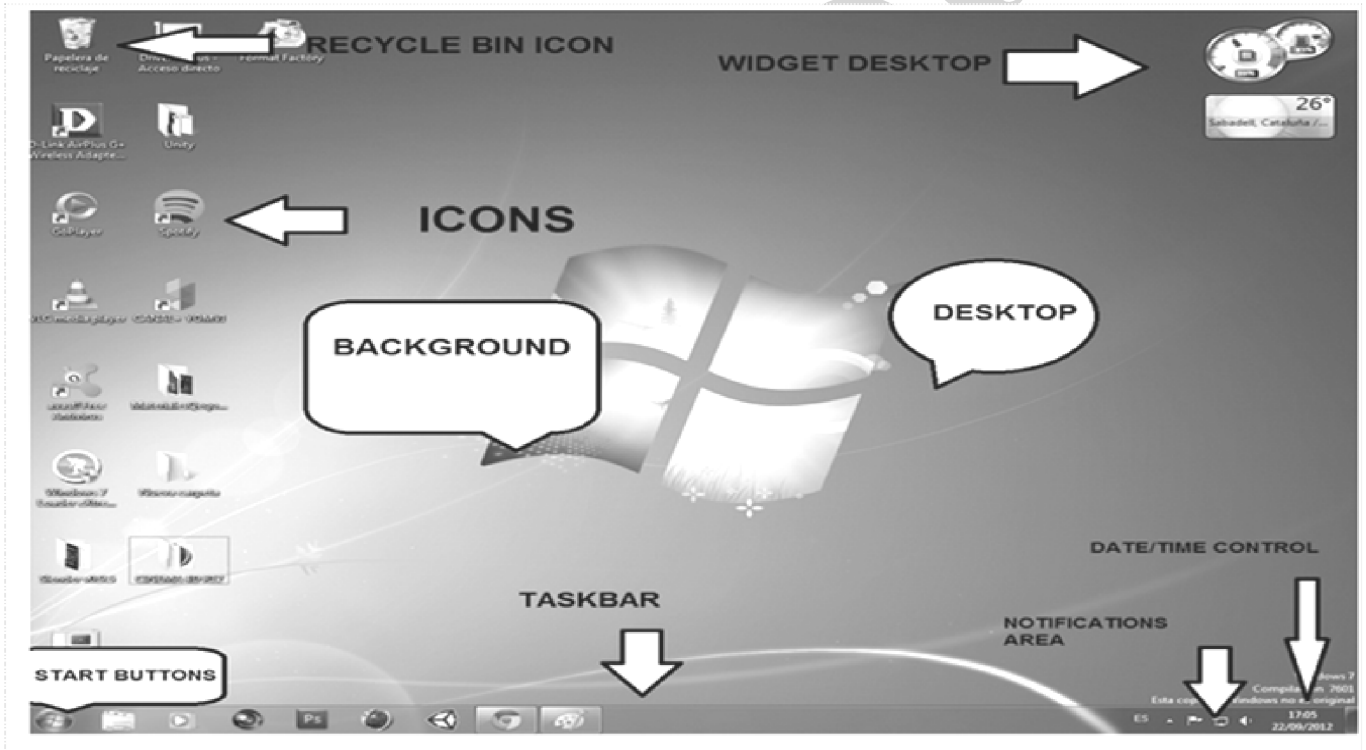

**DESK TOP :-** This is the main screen of Ms. Window's. It is used by some operating system.

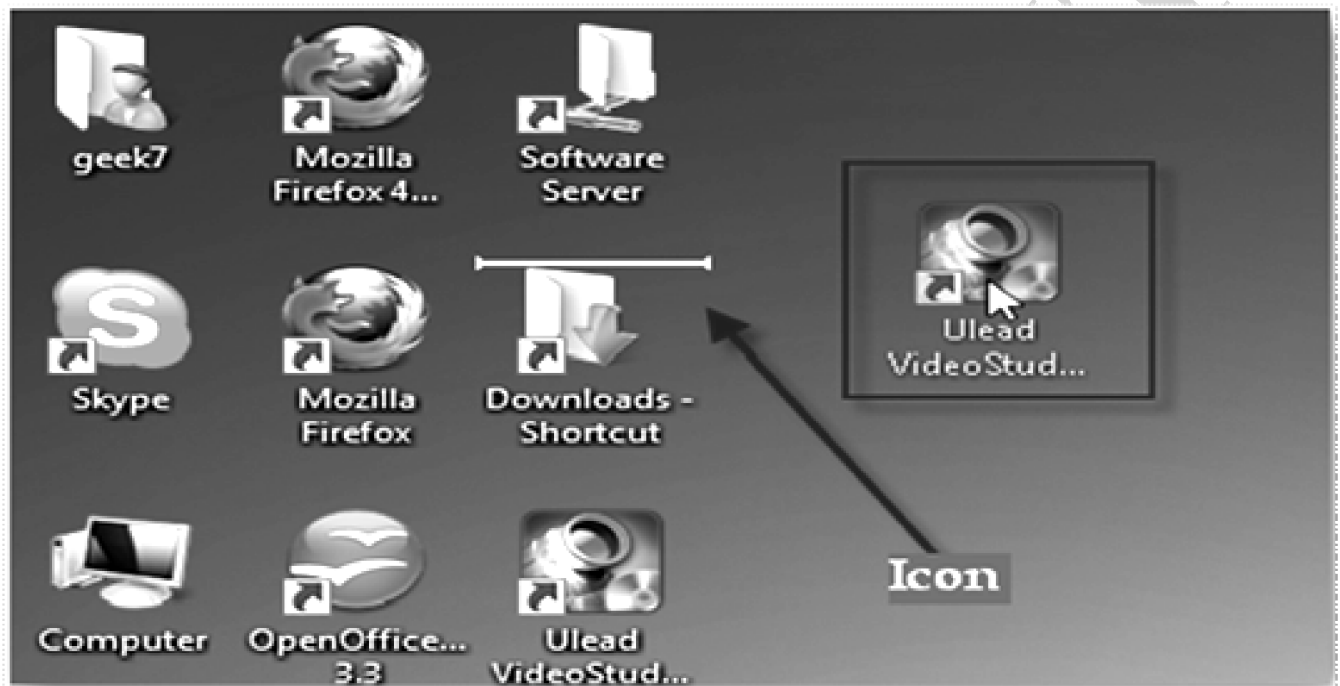


**STATUS BAR :-** It is a strip or bar along the bottom of the screen as information is display by most application here.

- ☞ From Illustrations Group, Click on Shapes

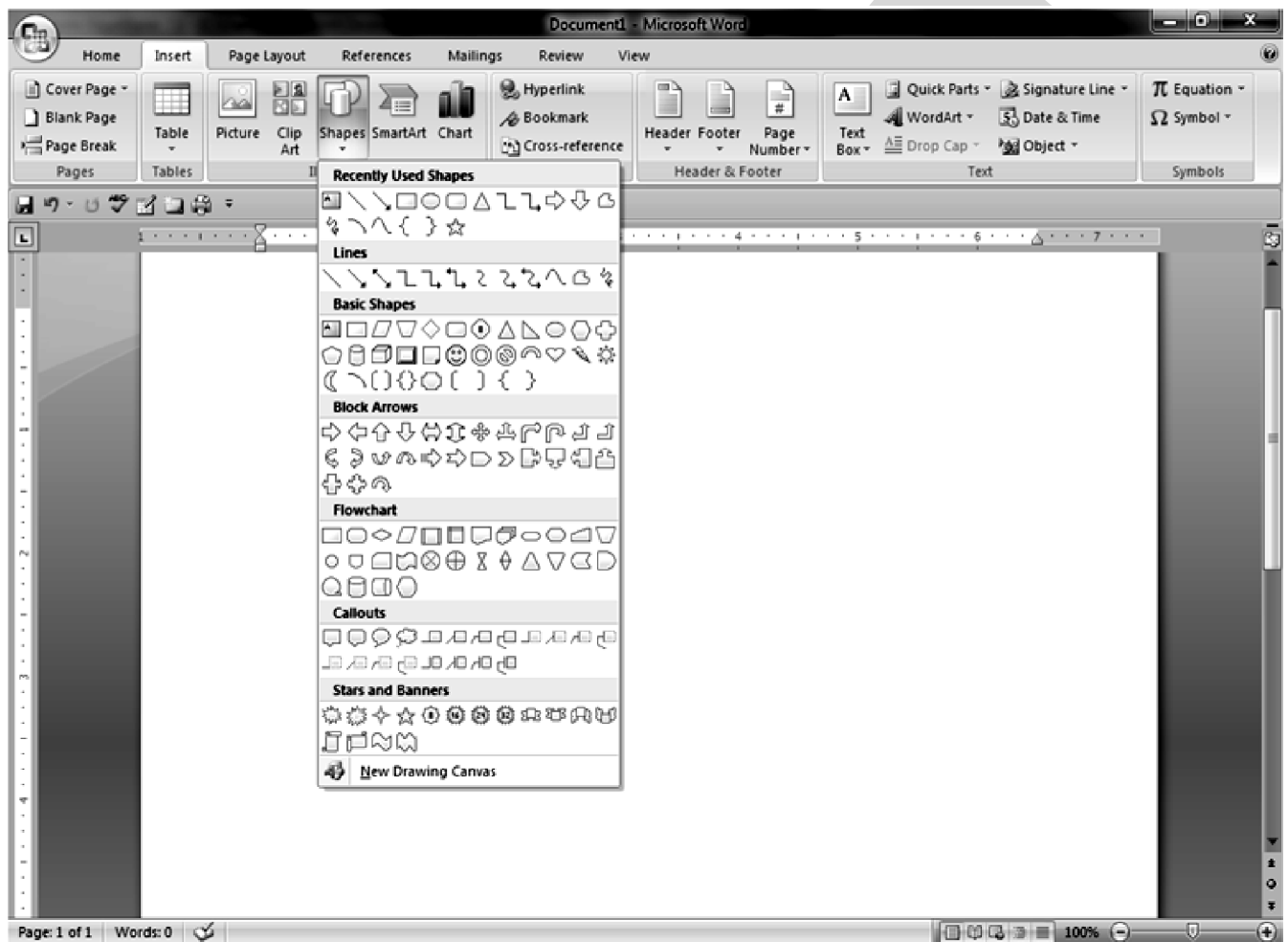

Different categories of AutoShapes available in Word 2007. We will briefly discuss some of them here.

1. **Lines** - After clicking the Lines button on the AutoShapes toolbar draw a **straight line**, **arrow**, or **double-ended arrow** from the first row of options by clicking the respective button. Click in the worksheet where you would like the line to begin and click again where it should end. To draw a **curved line** or **freeform shape**, select curved lines from the menu. Click in the document where the line should appear, and click the mouse every time a curve should begin. End creating the graphic by clicking on the starting end or pressing the **ESC** key. To **scribble**, click the last button in the second row, click the mouse in the document and hold down the left button while you draw the design. Let go of the mouse button to stop drawing.

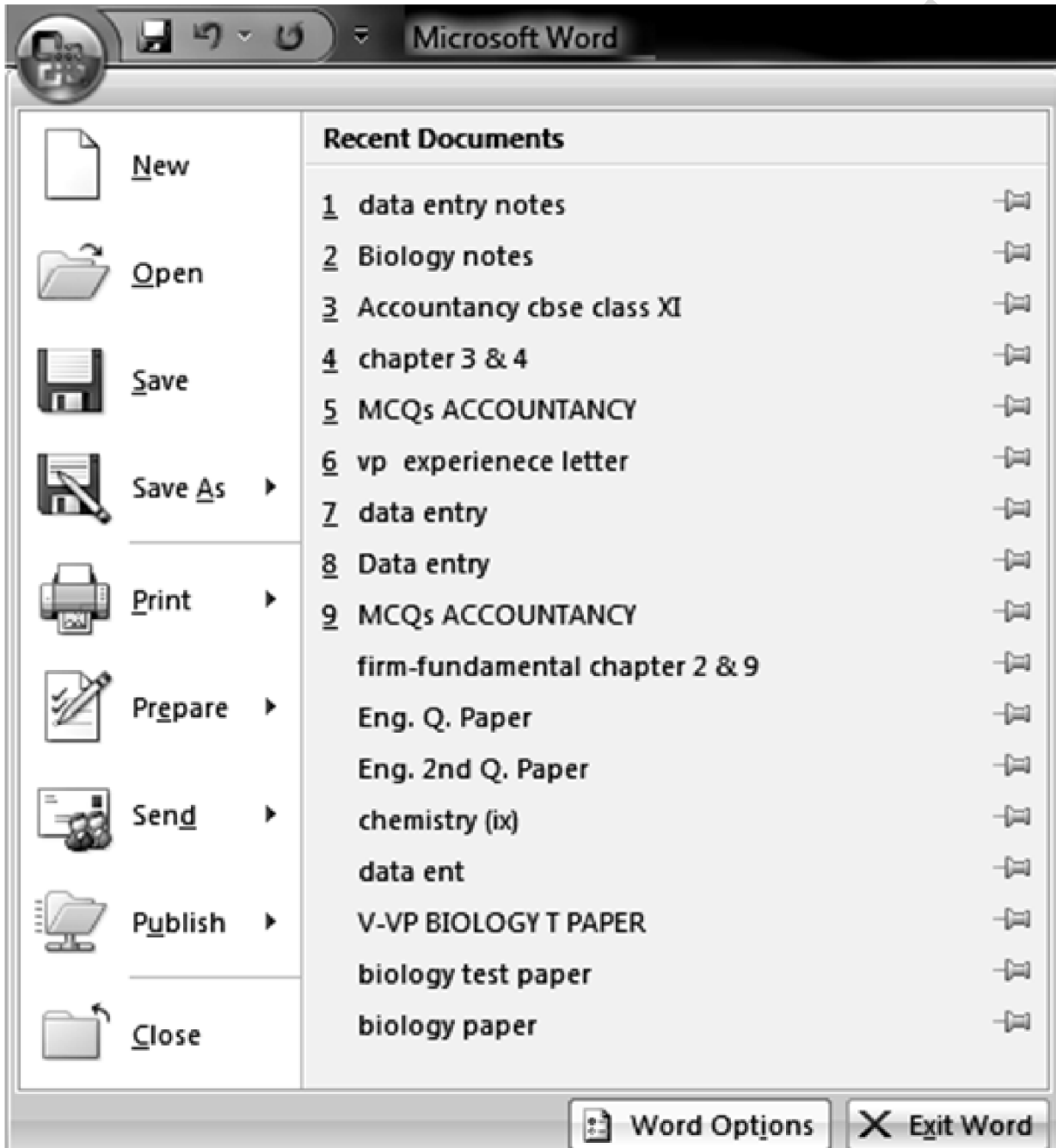
2. **Connectors** - These lines can be used to connect flow chart elements.
3. **Basic Shapes** - Click the Basic Shapes button on the Autosshapes toolbar to select from many **two and three dimensional shapes, icons, braces, and brackets**. Use the drag - and - drop method to draw the shape in the document. When the shape has been made, it can be resized using the open box handles and other adjustments specific to each shape can be modified using the yellow diamond handles.
4. **Block Arrows** - Select Block Arrows to choose from many types of **two and three-dimensional arrows**. Drag-and-drop the arrow in the document and the use the open box and yellow diamond handles to adjust the arrowheads.



5. **Flow Charts** - Choose from the flow chart menu to add **flow chart elements** to the document and use the lines menu to draw connections between the elements. We have drawn a flowchart using lines, flow chart elements and connectors.
6. **Stars and Banners** - Click the button to select **stars bursts, banners, and scrolls**.
7. **Call Outs** - Select from the **speech and thought bubbles, and line call outs**. Enter the call out text in the text box that is made.

## ☞ CLOSE A MICROSOFT WORD:-

To close the current document file, select **Office button** → **Close** Command on the menu bar. If the file contains any unsaved changes, you will be prompted to save the file before closing.



## ☞ EXIT MICROSOFT WORD PROGRAM:-

When finished your work in Microsoft Word and closed all the files, you can quite the Microsoft Word program by selecting **Office button** → **Exit Word** command on the menu bar.

## EXCEL - AN INTRODUCTION



### HOW TO WORK WITH EXCEL:

If a novice user wants to start Excel, it is highly recommended to complete the task in very systematic manner. If you're really interested to be a good user don't forget the following sequence of excel learning, after completing these steps you'll be much confident about the conceptual part of Excel. The steps are given as:

- ☞ Start the Excel Session
- ☞ Working with single/multiple sheets
- ☞ Calculation
- ☞ Saving
- ☞ Editing and Formatting of Worksheet
- ☞ Graphical representation
- ☞ Advanced features
- ☞ Web based applications of Excel.
- ☞ Data interface with other family member of OFFICE



Excel basic file format is the workbook which can hold multiple worksheet. A worksheet is a collection of information laid out in columns and Row.

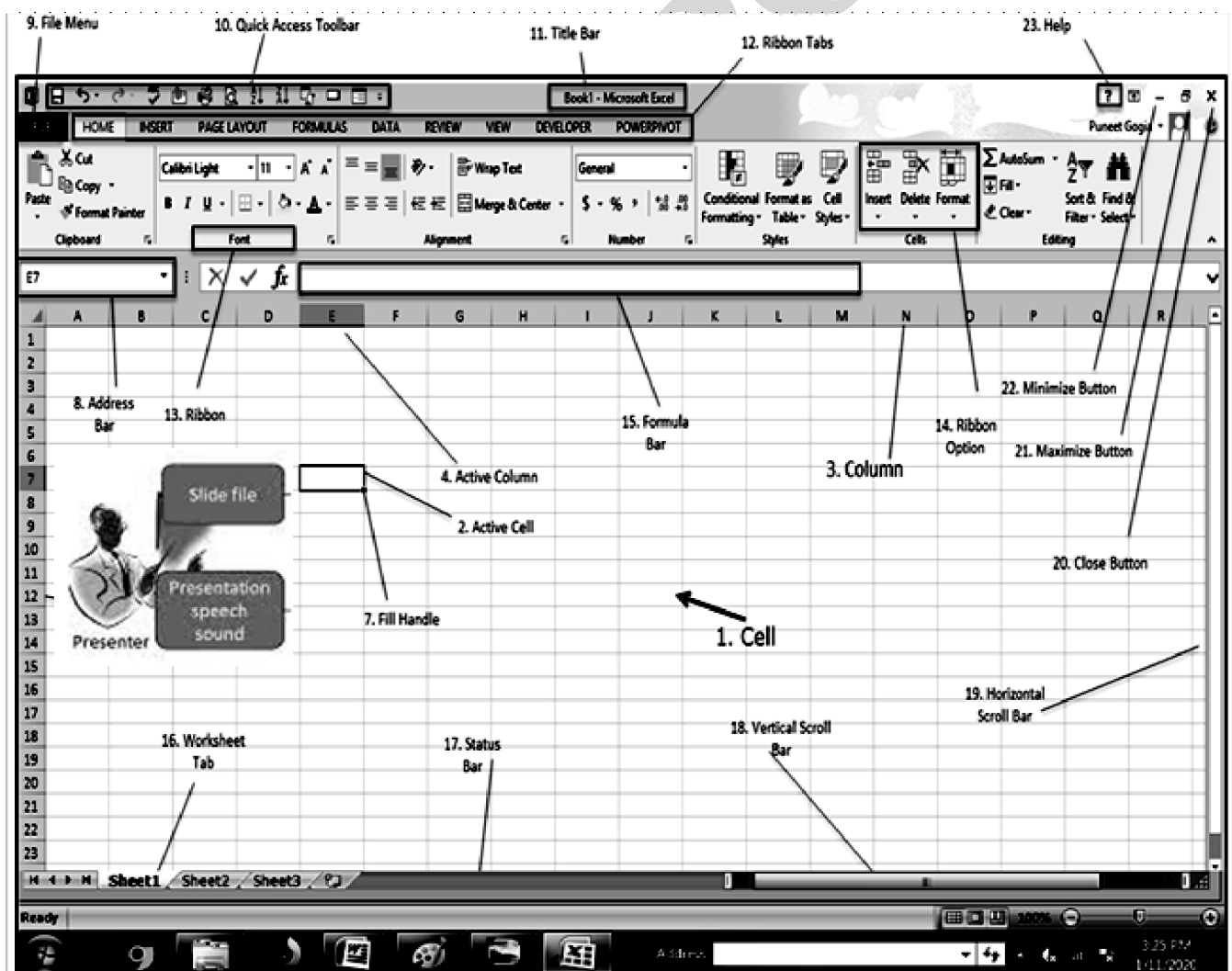
- ☞ A Value is a piece of information that does not change. Values can be texts, numbers, dates or times. A cell containing a value usually display the value.
- ☞ A formula is a collection of values, cell references, operators and predefined function that, when evaluated by Excel, produces a result.
- ☞ “The Worksheet Is Grid Of Columns And Rows. The Letter And Number Of The Columns And Rows Are Displayed In Gray Buttons Across The Top And Left Side Of The Worksheet.”
- ☞ The start menu, choose Programs and then select Microsoft Excel from the Microsoft offices list shown.

### ☞ EXCEL : AN INTRODUCTION

Microsoft Excel is the most popular spreadsheet program. Microsoft Excel's interface is intuitive and easy to use, although all its numerous features and functions can be intimidating. However, you can easily master the basics of Excel, and once you have done that, it's relatively straight forward to learn the more complex aspects of the program. To simply classify Excel as a spreadsheet program is in-appropriate, because its data analysis and presentation capabilities go beyond those of a standard spreadsheet - and its an application development environment. This means that by using only Excel, you can design a complete, customized application that does just what you need due to its following features.

- ☞ Multiple Undo up to the last 16 actions.
- ☞ Easier entry of range dialog boxes that except range references.
- ☞ references in dialog boxes collapses the dialog box to a smaller size.

## ☞ HOW TO WORK WITH EXCEL :

If a novice user want to start Excel, it is highly recommended to complete the task in very systematic manner. If you're really interested to be a good user don't forget the following sequence of excel learning after completing these steps you'll be much confident about it.

- ☞ Start the Excel Session.
- ☞ Working with single/multiple sheets.
- ☞ Calculation.
- ☞ Saving.
- ☞ Editing and Formatting of Worksheet
- ☞ Graphical representation.
- ☞ Advanced features
- ☞ Web based applications of Excel.
- ☞ Data Interface with other family members



### ☞ The brief description of each step is given as follows

- a) **Start the session:** After starting the session of Excel it appears with a set of worksheet of 3 family members, several row/column and cells as discussed earlier where it is ready to solve all the data manipulation part related to excel. At this stage you can start the Data entry, Editing, Deleting, Adding different font, colour, scaling size, relate data with appropriate formulae, etc. Some of the task will be done automatically and rest has to be done as per your requirement.
- b) **Working with Single/Multiple sheet:** All the said data will be entered into cells which is a part of the worksheet where you're free to work with the single sheet and multiple sheet. If a financial or annual presentation requires the summary data on the main page and related data on a different part of the same worksheet or any other worksheet, it can be arranged as per the user's choice. If a user wants to complete the required task under the same worksheet or multiple sheets, the main data will be calculated and linked to the main page of presentation where you have the options to complete the task by simple linking of data and hyper linking to jump into the document after user's request. Multiple sheets can be used for keeping all the data in separate segment which can be linked later.
- c) **Calculation:-** The calculation will be done after the final compilation of entire statement with the help of formulae and Functions (which has several categories) based on the data segments, a lot many inbuilt functions and formulae have been given.
- d) **Saving:-** The saving of entered data is much important for you for further accessing because after entering the data and making calculation, it is utmost important to save the working status. It has several options which will be discussed later.

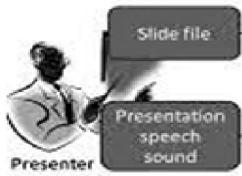
✎ **WORKING WITH CHARTS:-** Prologue to charts : It is said that one picture is worth a thousand words. In any data presentation system charts plays a role for analytical representation of data. If you are much aware about the statistics and believe in analysis and management part you can take chance with excel charting system that shows the final touch of any data analysis system. To complete the task first data preparation part of any business or corporate model is very necessary. If you're new to Excel go in more concise way to understand the main stuff like Creating a chart, How worksheet data is represented in a chart, Embedded charts and chart sheets. ✎ **WHY CHARTS?** Chart are visually appealing and make it easy for users to see comparisons; patterns, and trends in data. For instance, rather than having to analyze several columns of worksheet numbers, you can see at a glance whether sales are falling or rising over quarterly periods, or how all the actual sale compare to the projected sales. You can create a chart on its own shet or as an embedded object on a worksheet. You can also publish a chart on a Web page. To create a chart, you must first enter the data for the chart on the worksheet. Then select that data and use the Chart Wizard to step through the process of choosing the chart type and the various chart options.

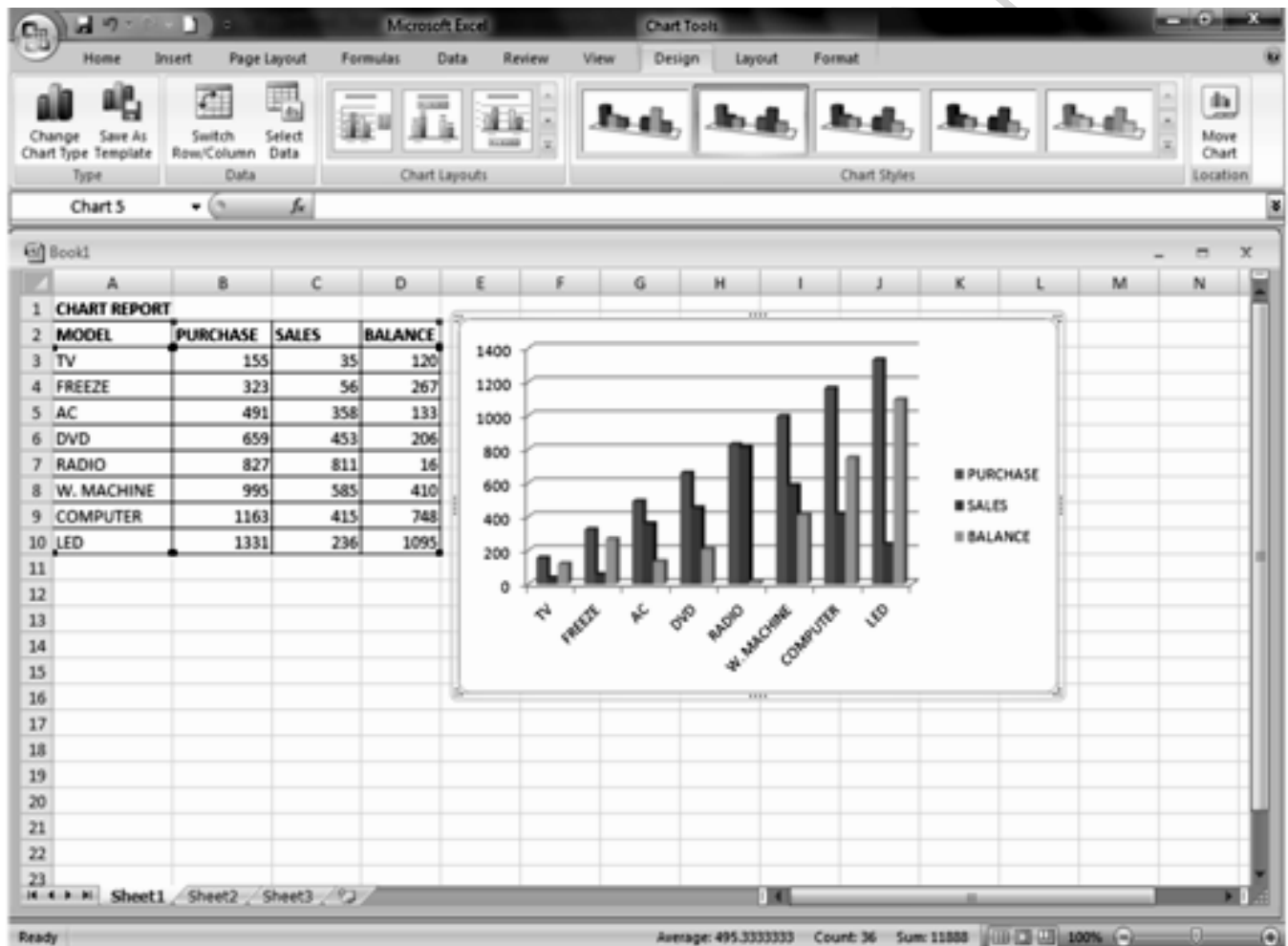
✎ **BASIC CONCEPT:-** The charts can be created based on some data models. If you are not aware about the details just think that a complete data model can present the complete charts which can be embedded or non-embedded. If it is embedded the mapping of chart will be automatically changed after entering the data. In Excel you have the options that you can create the charts with the help of wizards or by following the steps given in excel. The following facts are much important for any chart representing system.



✎ **Working data and chart:** You can also create a chart in one step without using the Chart Wizard. When create this way, the chart uses a default chart type and formatting, that you can change later. Worksheet data is represented in a chart: A chart is linked to the worksheet data and it's created and updated automatically when you change the worksheet data. The appearance of chart is completely based on following tables.

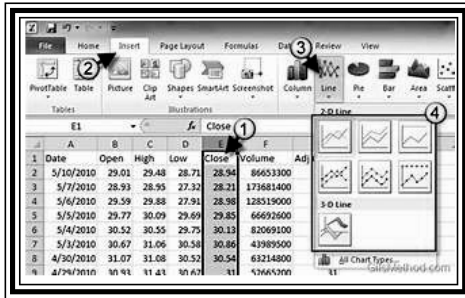
✎ **COMPONENTS OF A CHART:-**

**Axis value:** Microsoft Excel creates the axis values from the worksheet data, Note that the axis values in the example above range from 0 to 9000, which encompasses the range of values on the worksheet. Unless you specify differently, Excel uses the format of the upper-left cell in the value range as the number format for the axis.



- ✎ **Category names:** Excel uses column or row heading in the worksheet data for category axis names. In the example above the worksheet row heading 1st Quarter, 2nd Quarter, and so on appear as category axis names. You can change whether Excel uses column or row headings for category axis names or create different names.
- ✎ **Chart data series names :** Excel also uses column or row headings in the worksheet data for series names. Series name appear in the chart legend. In the example above, the row headings Projected and Actual appear as series names. You can change whether Excel uses column or row headings for series names or create different names.

✎ **DATA MARKERS:-** Data markers with the same pattern represent one data series. Each data marker represents number from the worksheet. In the example above, the rightmost data marker represents the Actual 4th Quarter value of 6000.



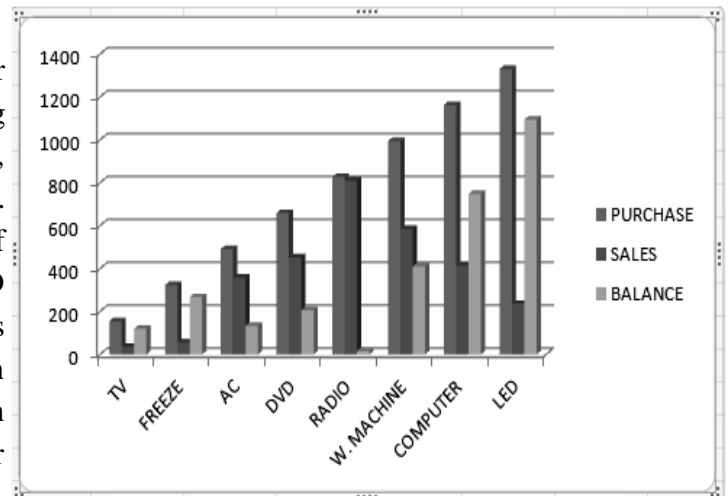

✎ **Chart sheet:** A chart sheet is a separate sheet within your workbook that has its own sheet name. Use a chart sheet when you want to view or edit large or complex charts separately from the worksheet data or when you want to preserve screen space as you work on the worksheet.

✎ **TYPE OF CHART:** The main types of charts available in Excel are fourteen (14), which has been divided into several sub categories called sub-segments. Each type of charts is fully compatible to present any business data. The Main kind of charts available in Excel is :

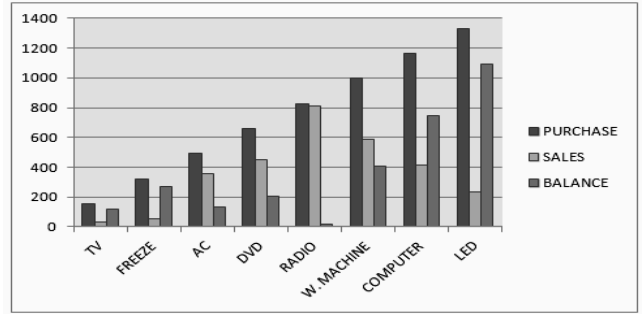
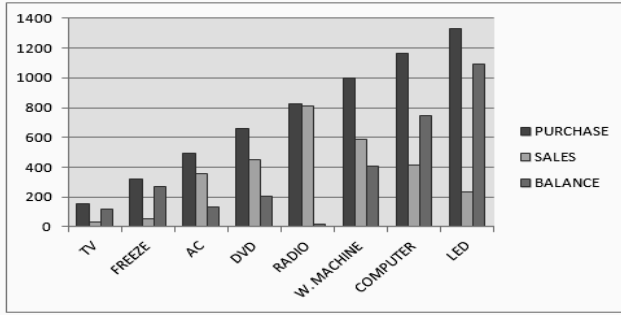

✎ **Column:** A column chart shows data changes over a period of time or illustrate comparisons among items. Categories are organized horizontally, values vertically, to emphasize variation over time. Stacked column charts show the relationship of individual items to the whole data. The 3-D perspective column chart compares data points along two axes. In this 3-D chart, you can compare four quarters of sales performance in Europe with the performance of two other divisions.

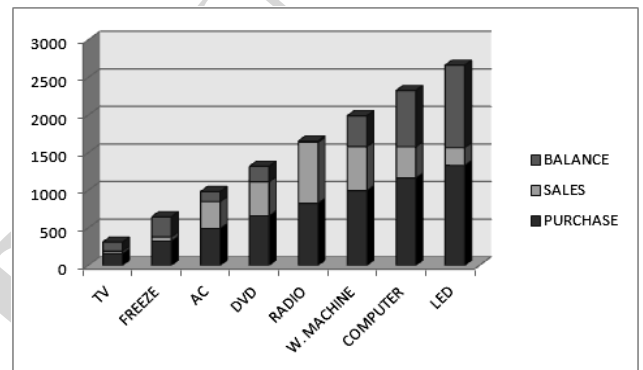
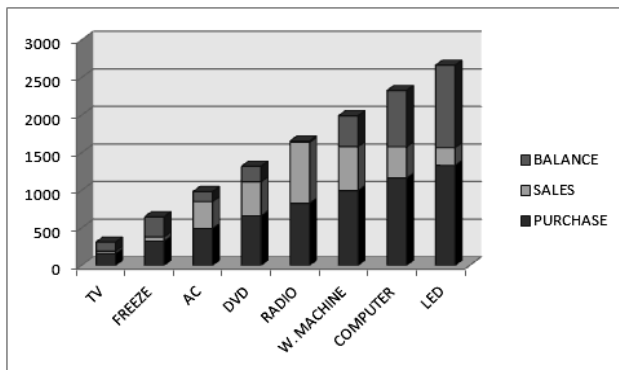




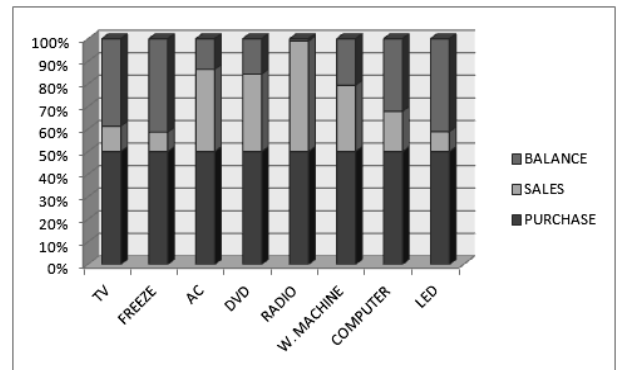
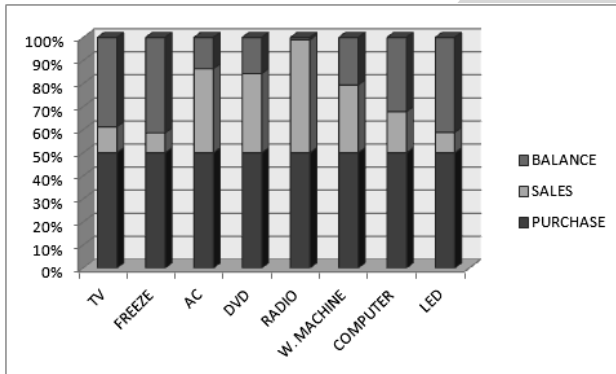

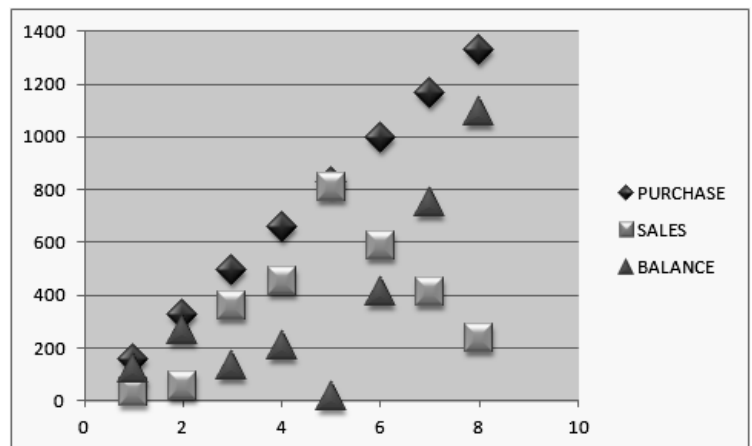
✎ **Line Chart** : A Line chart shows comparison along two data series on from of line and placed horizontally. One should use line chart when category labels are text representing evenly spaced values such as months, quarters or fiscal years.



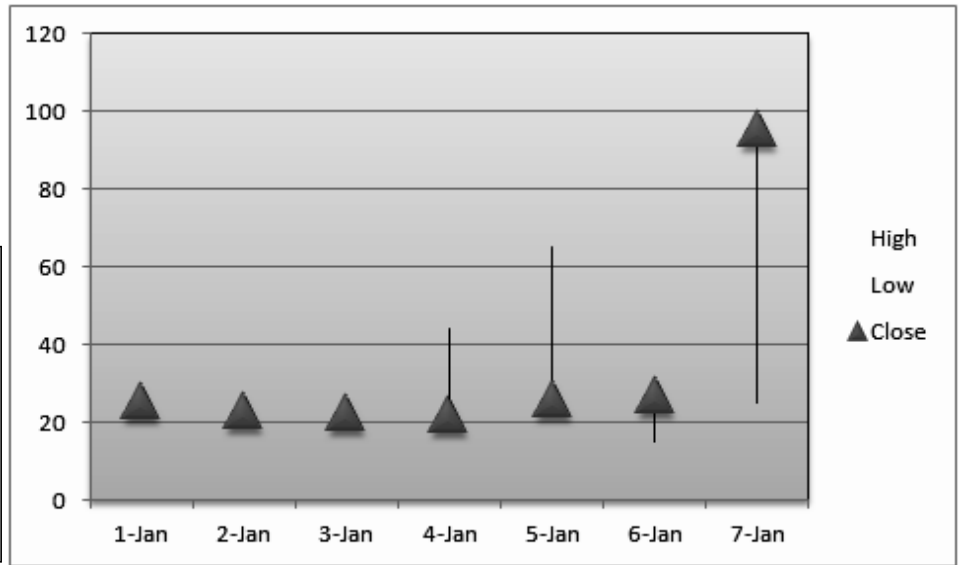
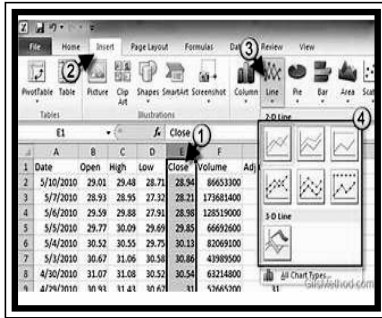
✎ **Bar**: A Bar chart illustrates comparisons among individual items. Categories are organized vertically, values horizontally, to focus on comparing values and do place less emphasis on time. Stacked bar charts show the relationship of individual items to the whole.



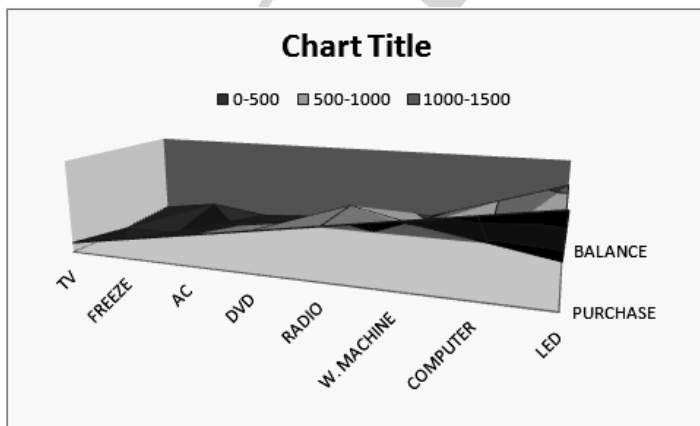
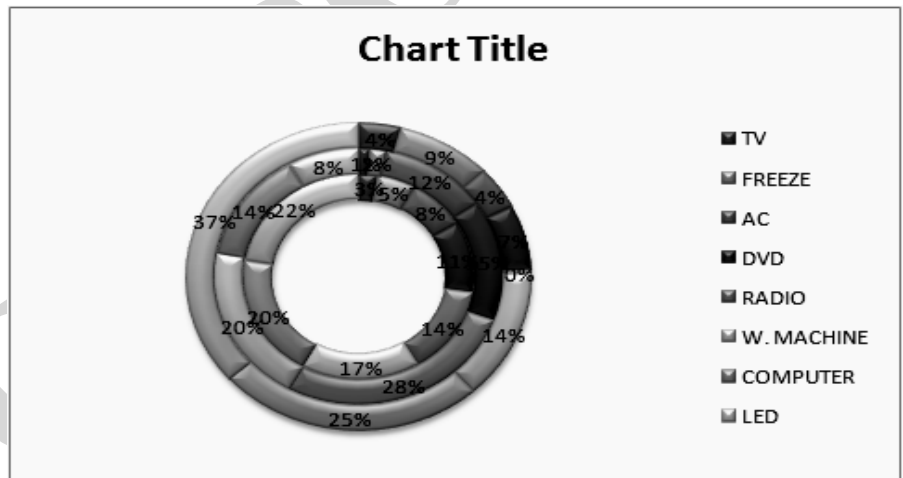
✎ **XY (Scatter)** : An XY (Scatter) chart either shows the relationships among the numeric values in several data series or plots two groups of numbers as one series of xy coordinates. This chart shows uneven intervals - or clusters - of data and is commonly used for scientific data. When you arrange your data, place (x) value in one row or column, and then enter corresponding (y) values in the adjacent rows or columns. The cone, cylinder, and pyramid data markers can lend a dramatic effect to 3-D column and bar charts.



✎ **Stock** : A stock chart that measures volume has two value axes: One for the columns that measure volume, and the other for the stock prices. You can include volume in a high-low-close or open-high-low-close chart.



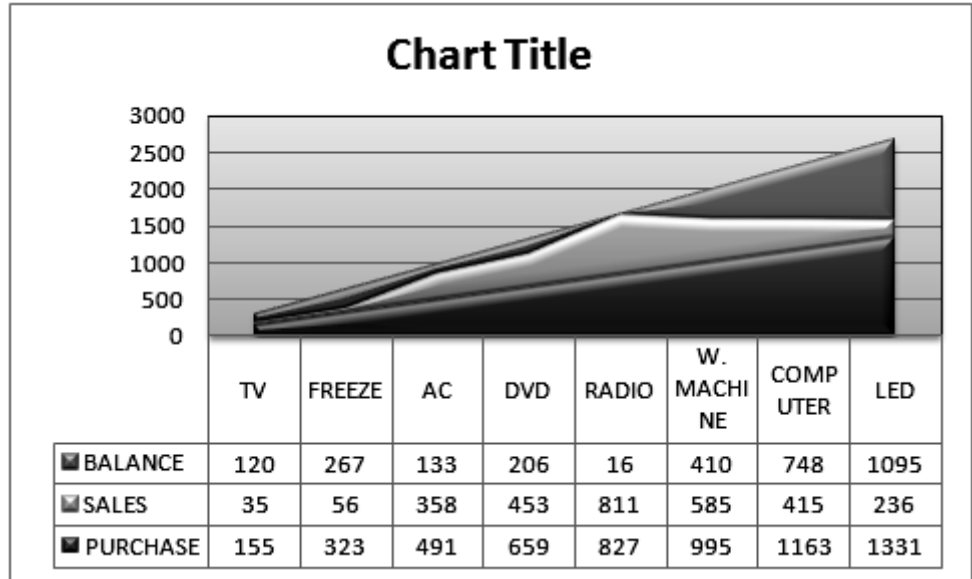
✎ **Doughnut** : Like a pie chart, a doughnut chart shows the relationship of parts to a whole, but it can contain more than one data series. Each ring of the doughnut chart represent a data series. The high-low-close chart is often used to illustrate stock prices. This chart can also be used for scientific data, for example, to indicate temperature changes. You must organize you data in the correct order to create this and othr stock charts.



✎ **Surface** : A surface chart is useful when you want to find optimum combinaitons between two sets of data. As in a topographic map, colours and patterns indicate areas that are in the same range of values. This chart shows the various combinations of temperature and time that result in the same measure of tensile strength. You have option to complete the selection of any kind of charts before and after formation of data model. In case of the complete formationof data, it can be enhanced by

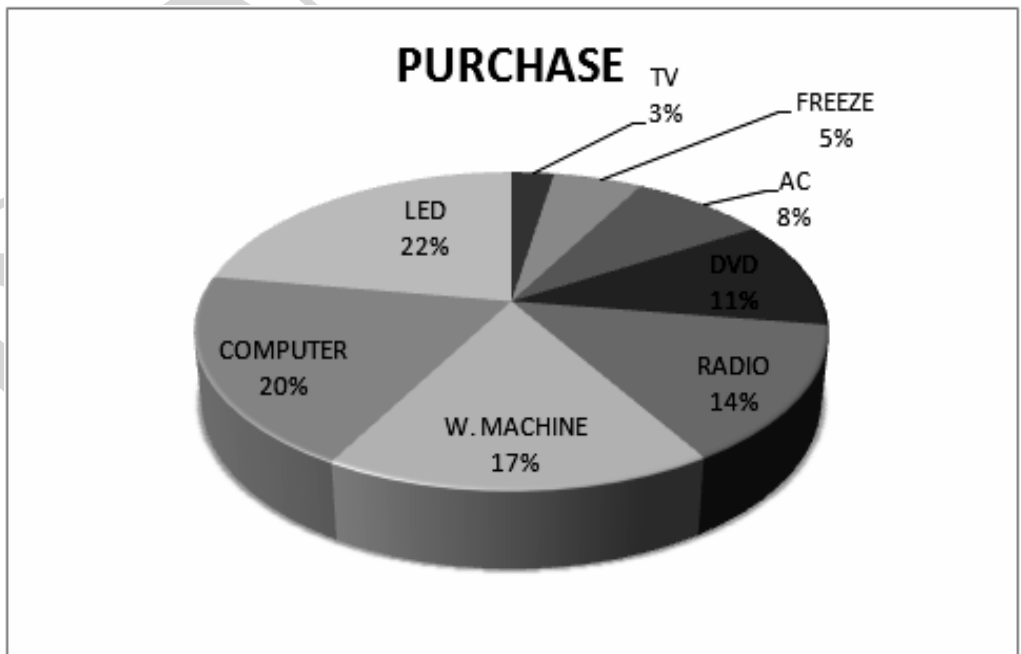
adding the element of charts for further presentation.

✎ **Area Charts :** Data that is arranged in columns or rows on a worksheet can be plotted in an area chart. Area charts emphasize the magnitude of change over time, and can be used to draw attention to the total value across a trend. For example, data that represents profit over time can be plotted in an area chart to emphasize the total profit.



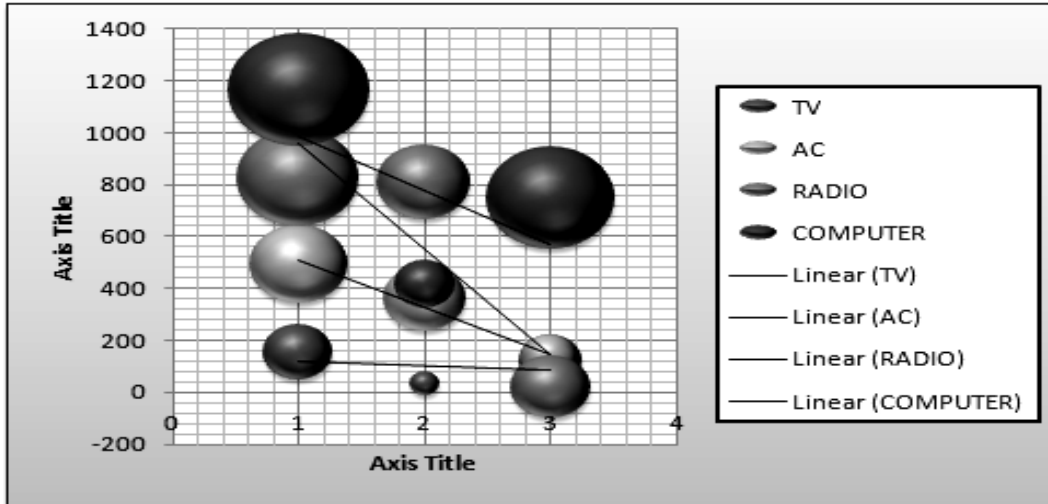
By displaying the sum of the plotted values, an area chart also shows in relationship of parts to a whole.

✎ **Pie Charts :** Data that is arranged in one column on row only on a worksheet can be plotted in a pie charts show the size of items in one data series (data series: Related data points that are plotted in a chart. Each data series in a chart has a unique color or pattern and is represented in the chart legend. You can plot one or more data series in a chart. Pie charts have only one data series.), proportional to the sum of the items. the data points (data points : Individual values plotted in a chart and represented by bars, columns, lines, pie or doughnut slices, dots, and various other shapes called data markers. Data markers of the same colour constitute a data series.) in a pie chart are displayed as a percentage of the whole pie



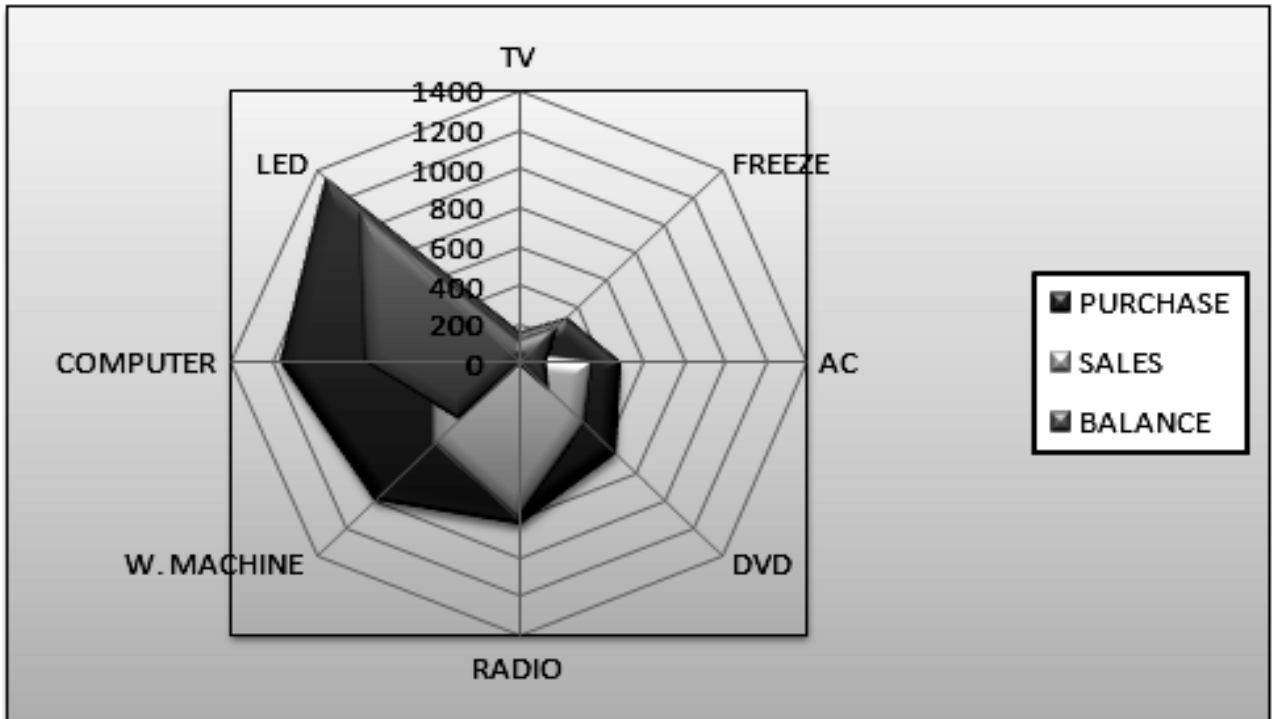
✗ **Bubble Charts** : Data that is arranged in columns on a worksheet so that (x) values are listed in the first column and corresponding (y) values and bubble size values are listed in adjacent columns, can be plotted in a bubble chart.

## ✗ CREATING A PIVOT TABLE REPORT :-

To create a Pivot Table report, use the Pivot Table and Pivot Chart Wizard as a guide to locate and specify the source data that you want to analyze and to create the report framework. You can then use the Pivot Table tool bar to arrange the data with that framework.

## ✗ TYPES OF PIVOT TABLE REPORTS:

A default Pivot Table report looks like the preceding example. You can also display a Pivot Table report in indented format, to view all the summary figures of the same type in one column. You can create a Pivot Chart report to view the data graphically. You can also make a Pivot Table report available on the Web by using a Pivot Table list on a Web page. When you publish an Excel Pivot Table report to a Pivot Table list, others can view and interact with the data from within their Web browsers.

✗ **PIVOT TABLE REPORTS: Elements:** A Pivot Table report in indented format is similar to a traditional database banded report or formatted report. The data for each row field is indented in a layout similar to a text outline. By using this format, you can read all of the summarized figures for a data field down a single column. It's useful for long reports or reports that you distribute as printouts.

✗ **ROW FIELDS:-** Field from the underlying source data that are assigned a row orientation in Pivot Table report. In the preceding example, Product and Sold by are row fields. A Pivot Table report that has more than one row field has one inner row field the one closest to the data area. Any other row field are referred to as outer row fields. Inner and outer row fields have different attributes. Items in the outermost field are displayed only once, but items in the rest of the field are repeated as needed.

✎ **COLUMN FIELD:-** A field that's assigned a column orientation in a Pivot Table report. In the preceding example, Quarters is a column field with two items, Qtr2 and Qtr3. A Pivot Table report can have multiple key info. column fields just as it can have row fields. Most indented format Pivot Table report do not have column fields.

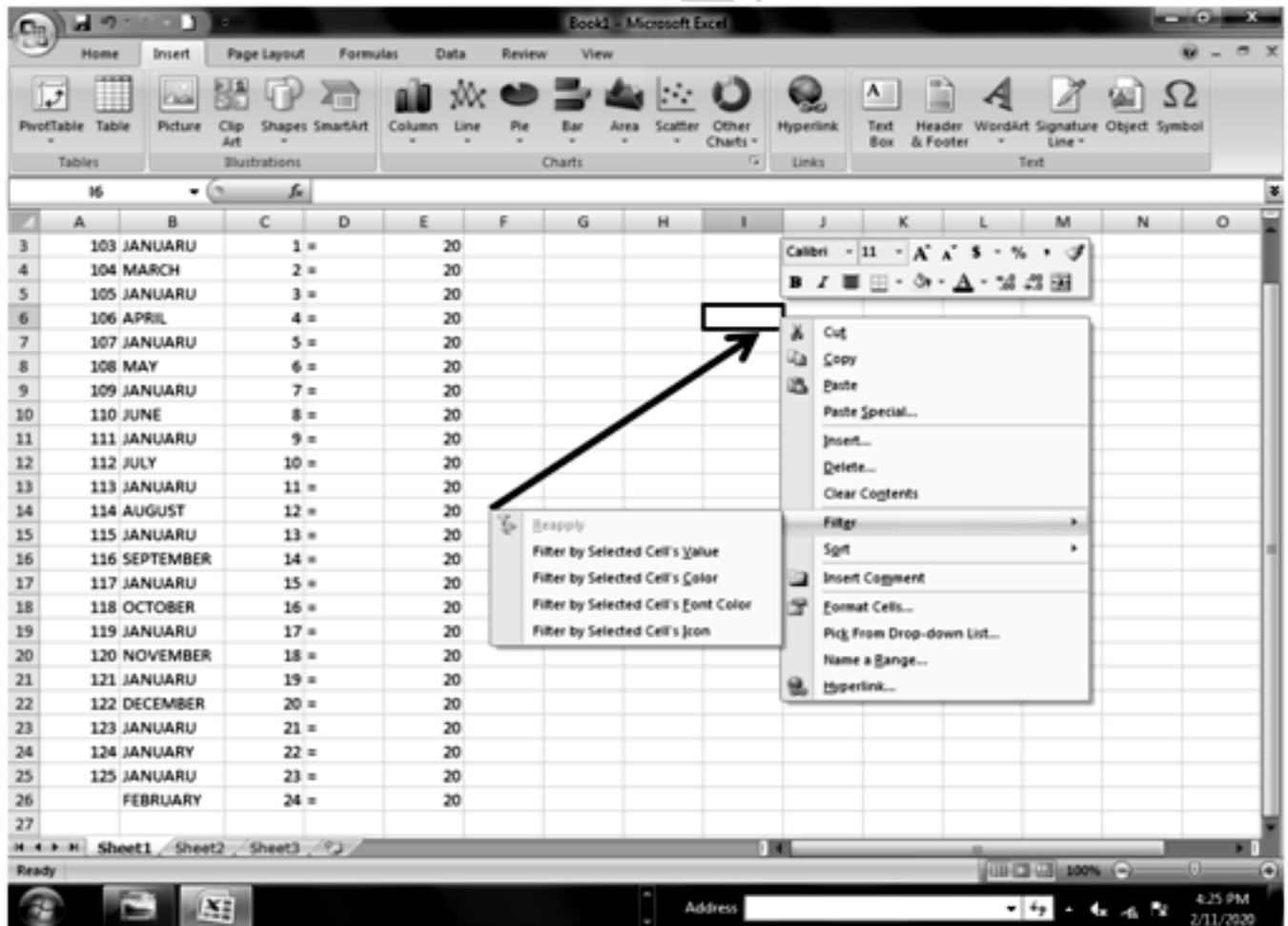
✎ **DATA FIELD:-** A field from a source list or database that contains data to be summarized. In the example, Sum of Sales is a data field that summarized the entries from the Sales field, or column, in the source data. In the indented-format report example, this field is named Sales instead of Sum of Sales.

A data field usually summarized numeric data, such as statistics or sales figures, but the underlying data can also be text. By default Microsoft Excel summarizes text data in Pivot Table reports by using the Count summary function and summarizes numeric data by using Sum.

✎ **CREATE A PIVOT TABLE REPORT:-** When you create a Pivot Table report, Microsoft Excel automatically create an associated Pivot Table report, and vice versa. If you have an existing Pivot Table report, ou can use it to create the Pivot Chart: report which will reflect the view of the table. When you base a Pivot Chart report on external on-OLAP source data, you might have to retrieve the external data before you create the report. Open the workbook where you want to create the Pivot Chart report.

If you are basing the report on an Excel list or database, click a cell in the list or database.

1. On the Data menu, click Pivot Table and Pivot Chart Report.
2. In step 1 in the Pivot Table and Pivot Chart Wizard, follow the instructions, and click Pivot Chart (with Pivot Table under What kind of report do you want to create?)



3. Follow the instructions in step 2 of the wizard.

4. In step 3 of the wizard, specify where you want to put the associated Pivot Table report. The Pivot Chart report is automatically created on a new chart sheet. Then determine whether you need to click Layout.

If you clicked Layout in step 3 of the wizard, after you lay out the Pivot Chart report in the wizard, click OK in the Layout dialog box and then click Finish to create the Pivot Chart report.

If you did not click Layout in step 3 of the wizard, click Finish, and then lay out the Pivot Chart report on the chart sheet.



#### ✎ DELETION OF A PIVOT TABLE REPORT

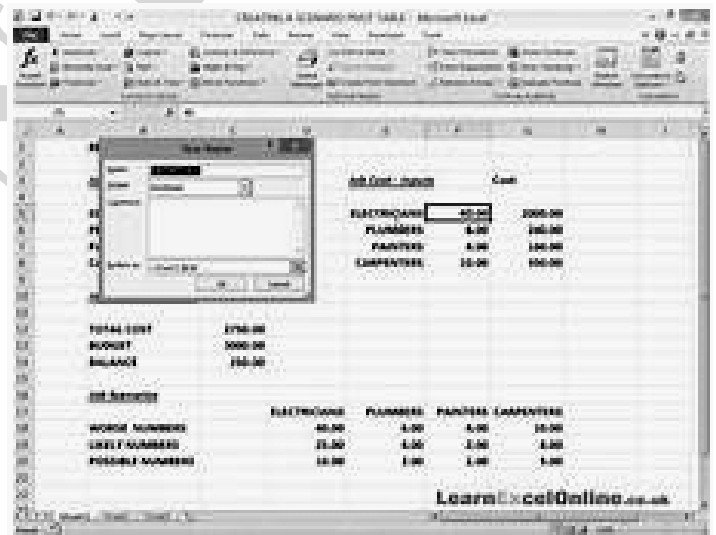
1. Click the Pivot Table report
2. On the Pivot Table toolbar, click Pivot Table, point to Select, and then click Entire Table.
3. On the Edit menu, point to Clear, and then click All.

The above details are sufficient to understand the complete handling of Pivot table elements with the complete systems. The shortcut key combinations for using the pivot table option is listed below.

#### ✎ Merge or unmerge cells for outer row and column items :

You can merge cells for row and column items in order to center the items horizontally and vertically, or to unmerge cells in order to left-justify items in the outer row and column fields at the top of the item group.

1. Click the Pivot Table report.
2. The **Options** tab, the **Pivot Table** group, click **Options**.  
The Pivot Table **Options** dialog box appears.
3. To merge or unmerge cells for outer row and column items, click the Layouts & Format tab, and then under the Layout section, select or clear the Merge and center cells with labels.



**Note :** You cannot use the **Merge Cells** check box under the **Alignment** tab in a Pivot Table report.

**✂ CHANGE THE NUMBER FORMAT FOR A FIELD :-**

1. In the Pivot Table report, select the field of interest.

On the Options tab in the **Active Field** group, click **Field Settings**.

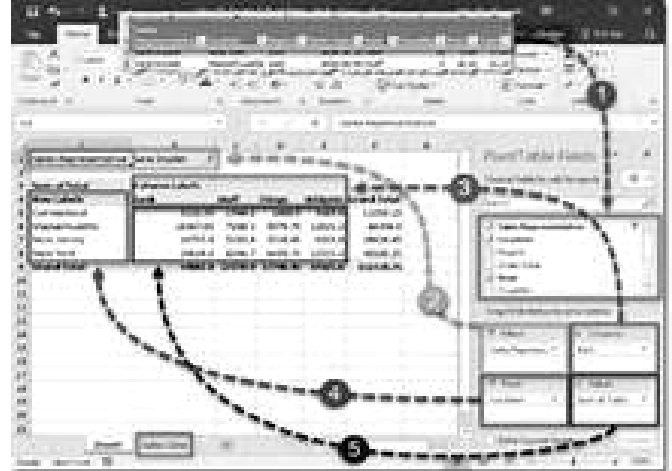
The **Filed Settings** dialog box displays labels and report filters; the **Values filed Settings** dialog box displays values.

Click **Number Format** at the bottom of the dialog box.

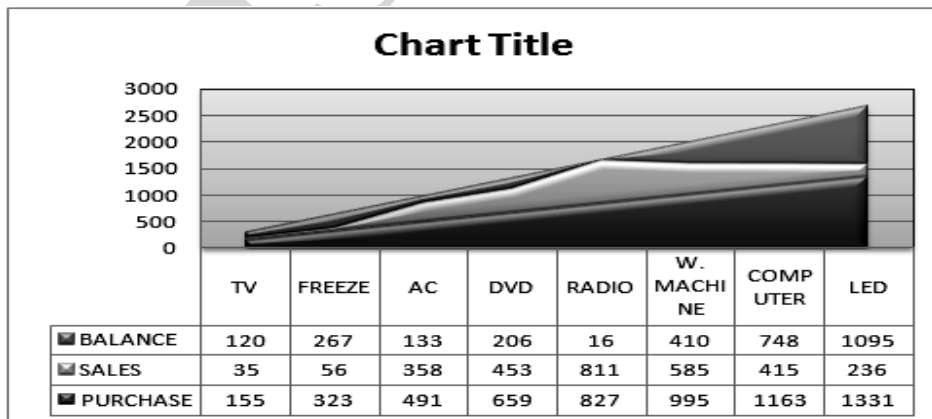
The **Format Cells** dialog box opens.

In the **Category** list, click the format category of interest.

Select the options that you prefer, and then click **OK** twice.



**✂ Area Charts :** Data that is arranged in columns or rows on a worksheet can be plotted in an area chart. Area charts emphasize the magnitude of change over time, and can be used to draw attention to the total value across a trend.

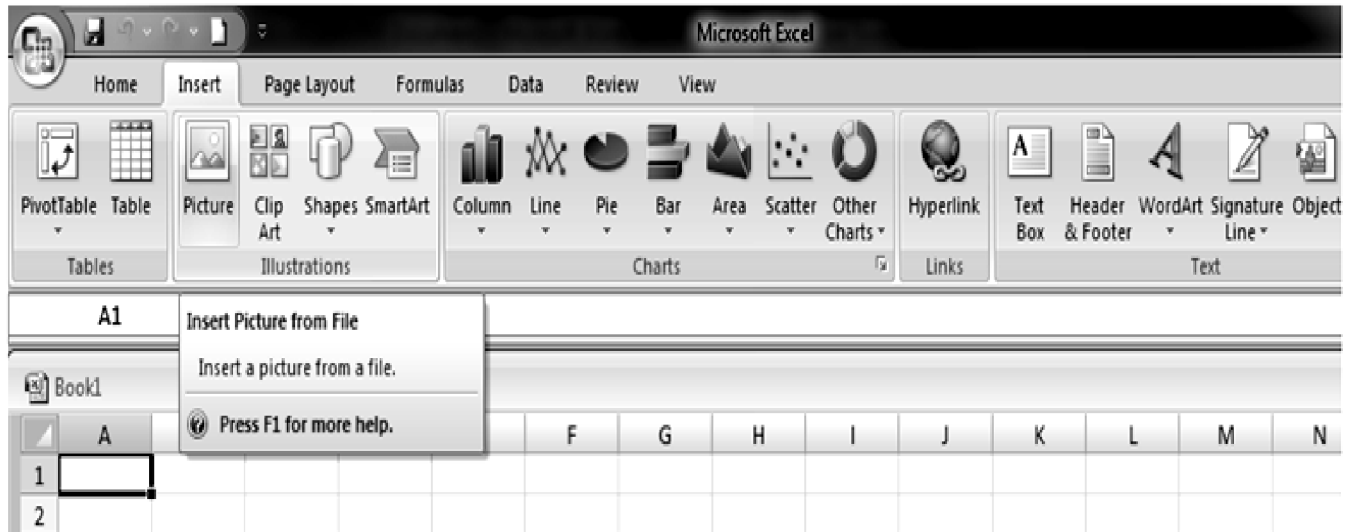


For example, data that represents profit over time can be plotted in an area chart to emphasize the total profit

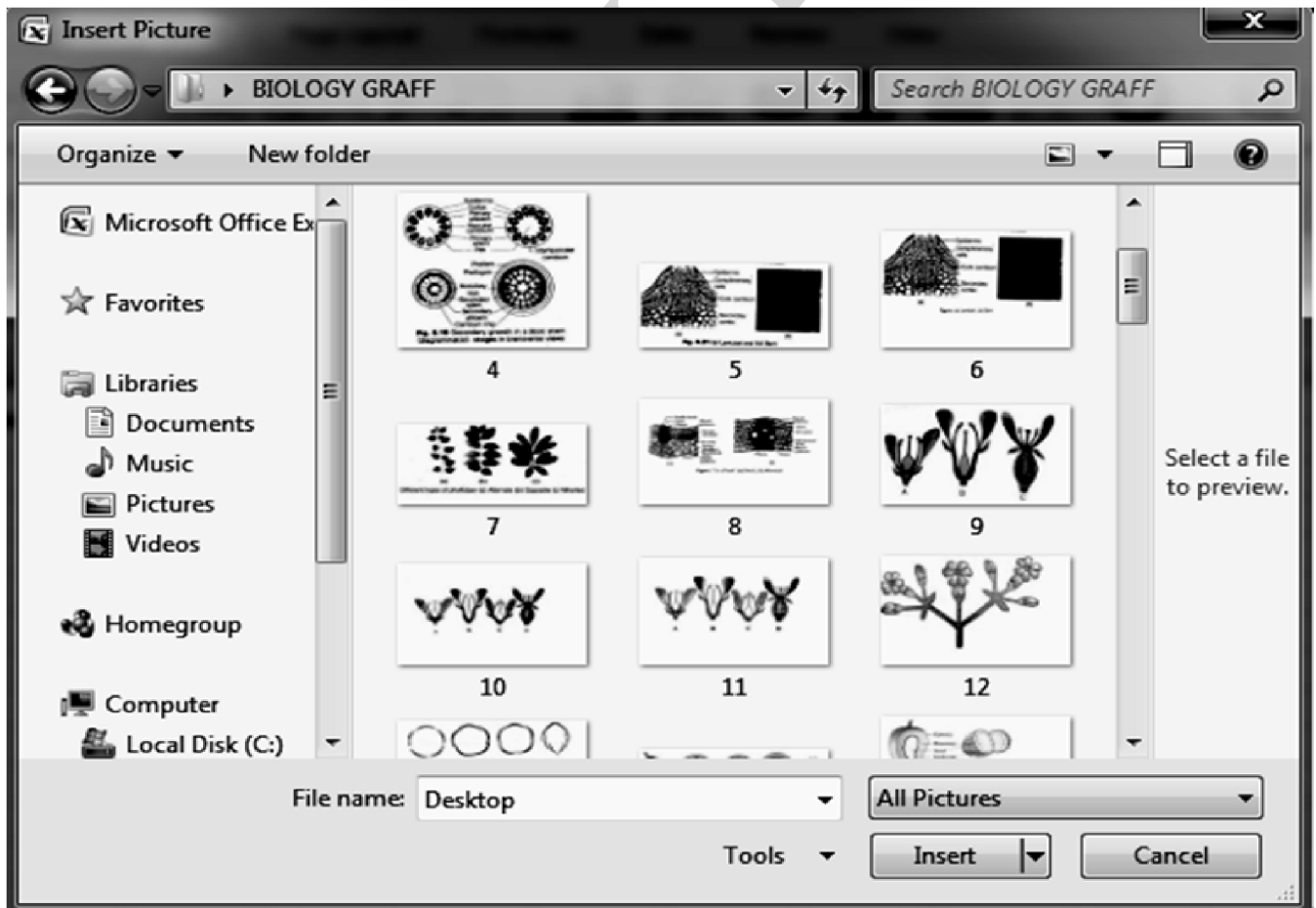
## INSERING & EDITING A PICTURE FROM A FILE

Follow these steps to add a picture, photo or graphic from an existing file :

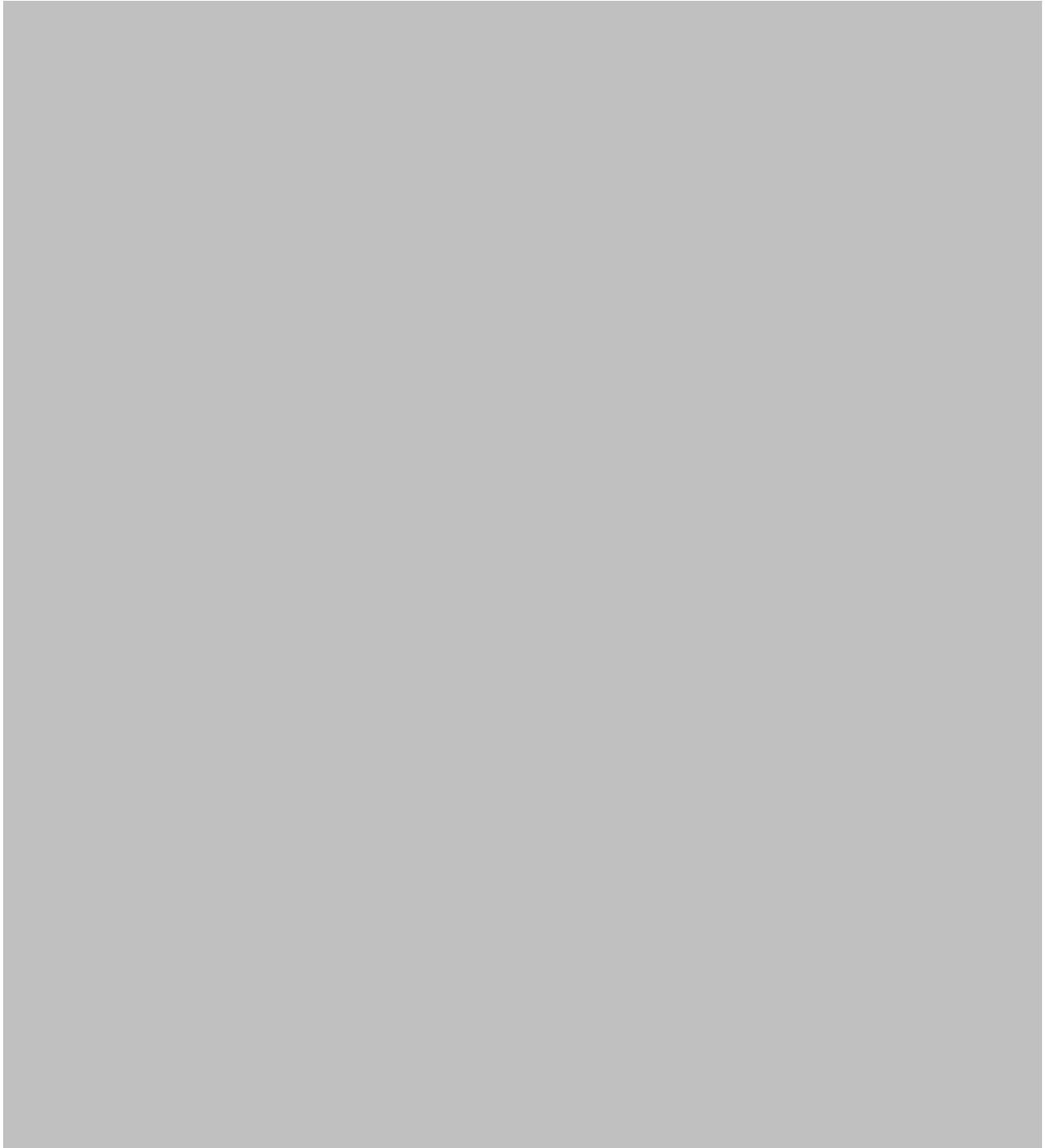
1. Click on Insert Tab.



2. From Illustrations Group, Click picture



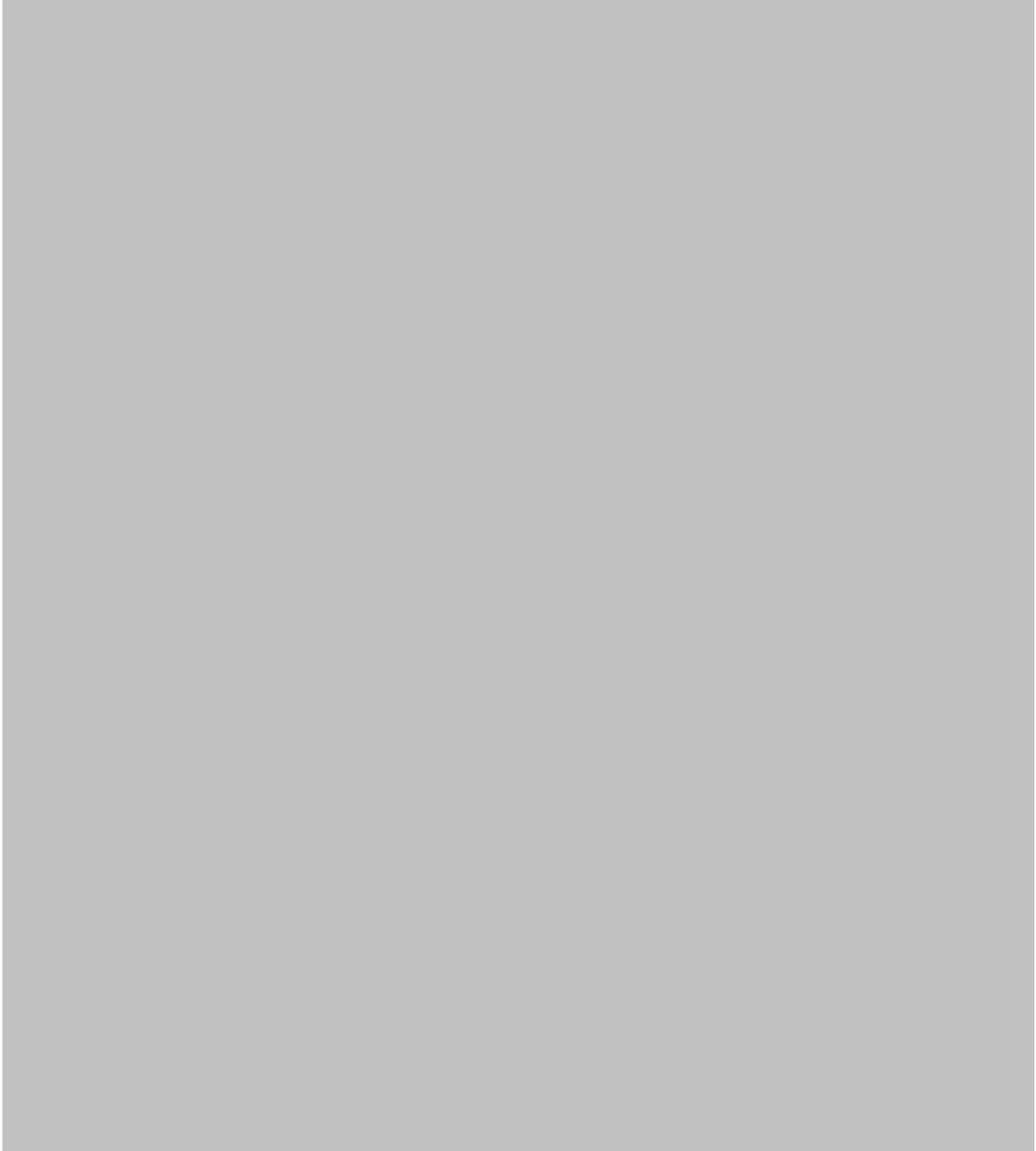
3. Now select a picture from the location of the picture (where you have stored the picture) and press enter or click on insert button.

To close the current document file, select **Offices button** → **Close** Command on the menu bar. If the file contains any unsaved changes, you will be prompted to save the file before closing.

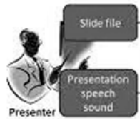


## **EXIT MICROSOFT EXCEL PROGRAM:-**

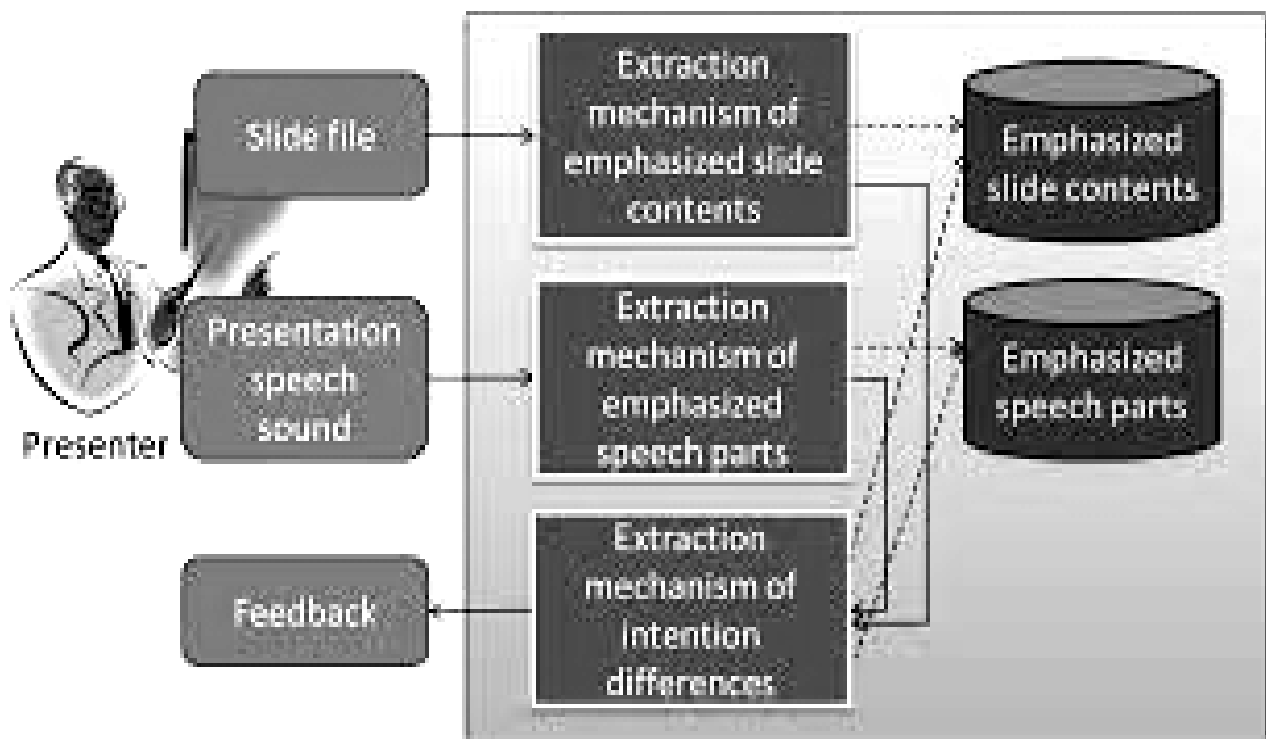

## POWERPOINT - AN INTRODUCTION

Whenever you appear in front of one or more people to present your ideas, deliver speech, give classroom lecture, organize computer conference, etc., you have a presentation. The basic purpose of any presentation is communication. To communicate effectively, you must state your facts in a simple, concise



and interesting manner. Any presentation consists of four basic elements: *You your audience, your message and your tools.*

In this lesson you will learn to create a presentation using Microsoft Power Point which is a complete presentation software. Even if you are not a multimedia expert, PowerPoint helps you create slides and present exciting slide shows. PowerPoint provides you helpful suggestions on the layout, design, and formats of your slides.

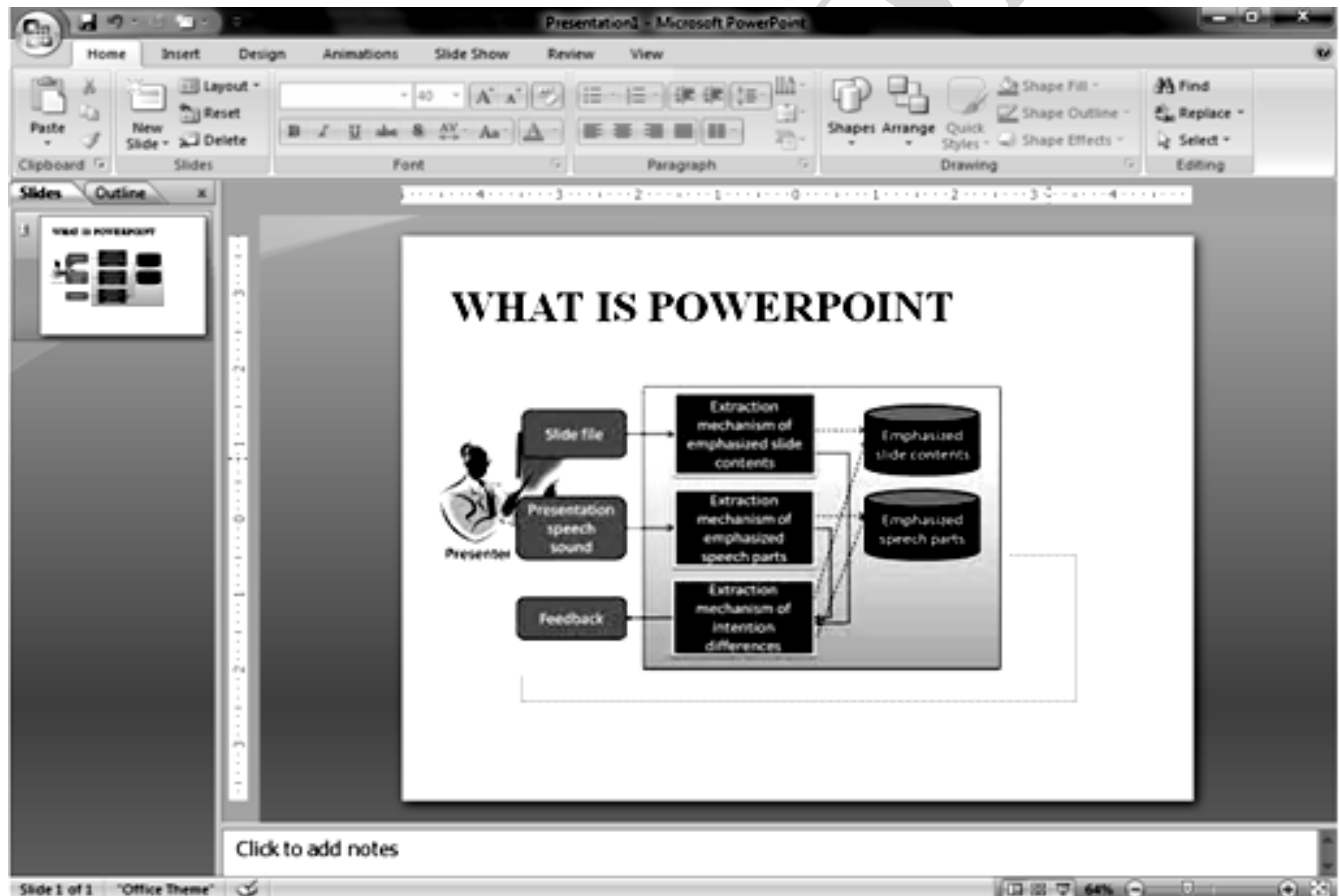
# WHAT IS POWERPOINT?

Power Point Is Designed To Help You Effectively Communicate Information To Others. Whether You're Talking About A New Advertising Campaign, The Design Of A Modern Intensive Care Unit, Or The Details Of A New Health Insurance Plan, You Need To Communicate Your Information In A Clear, Concise And Interesting Manner. Power Point Helps You To Both Create And Organize The Materials In Your Presentation.

## THE PARTS OF A PRESENTATION

You May Use A Variety Of Elements In Each Power Point Presentation, Depending On Your Needs. A Slide Is A Single Visual Image That Can Contain Text Graphics Charts- Just About Anything You Can Images! A Power Point Slide May Be Displayed On Paper, As An Overhead Transparency.

On A Computer Screen, Or As An Actual Slide That You Project.



- ✗ Audience Handouts Provide Printed Copies Of Your Slides Of Your Slides Along With Supporting Text.

- ✗ Select Template If You Want To Start By Selecting A Template That Specifies Certain Aspects Of Your Presentation Such As Colour Schemes And Fonts.
- ✗ Select Blank Presentation If You Want To Create, A Presentation From Scratch Using All Of Power Point Default Setting For Colour Font And So On.
- ✗ The multiledia features makes your slides sparkle. You can add clip art, sound effects, music, vedio clips etc.
- ✗ Preparing a presentation is easy in PowerPoint. Once if you have created slides, you can put them in order, time your slide show, and present them to your audience.

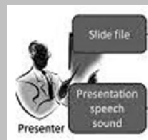
You can start your PowerPoint program in different ways. One way is using Start button.

When you start your PowerPoint Program, you see a Blank presentation.



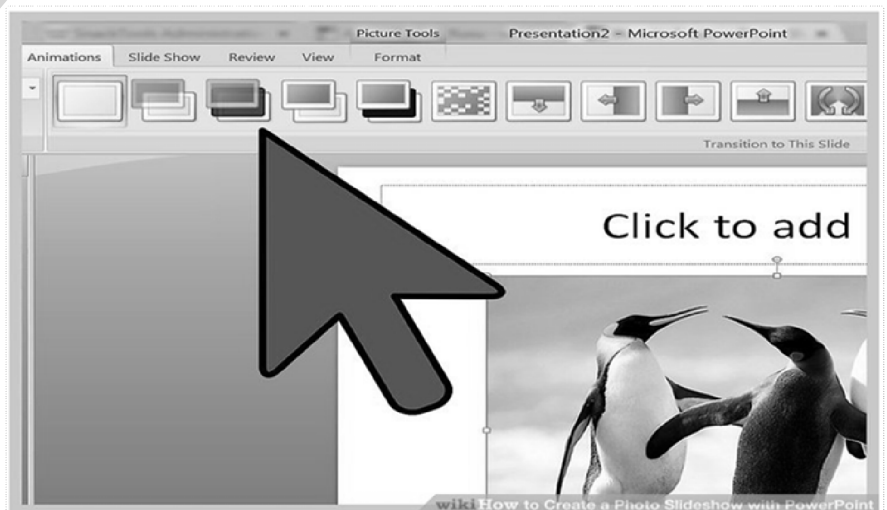

- **Groups** within each Tab break a task into **subtasks**.
- **Commands** button in each group carry out a command or display a menu of **commands**.
- You can also go to **Office button** on the top left corner of the page and click on **New**. You can choose a blank presentation from the page displayed.

## ➤ DESIGN A TEMPLATE:-

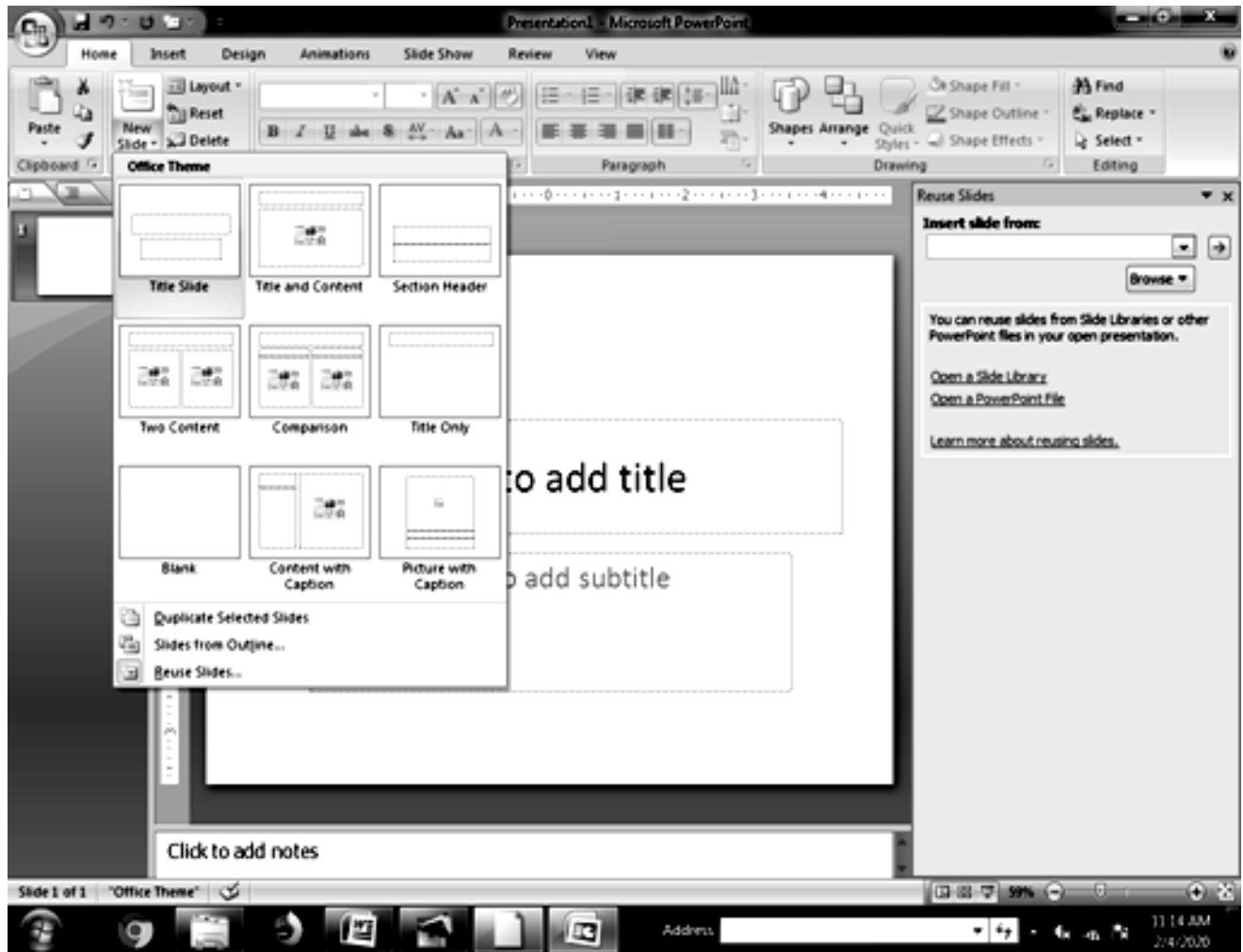
Click on the Installed Themes box to select the Design Template you want to use. A number of template



names will appear in the white box. These Installed Themes give you different backgrounds and text formatting to begin your presentation. Preview each design by highlighting the template name on the list. Press Create after you have chosen the design.



## ➤ SLIDE LAYOUTS:-



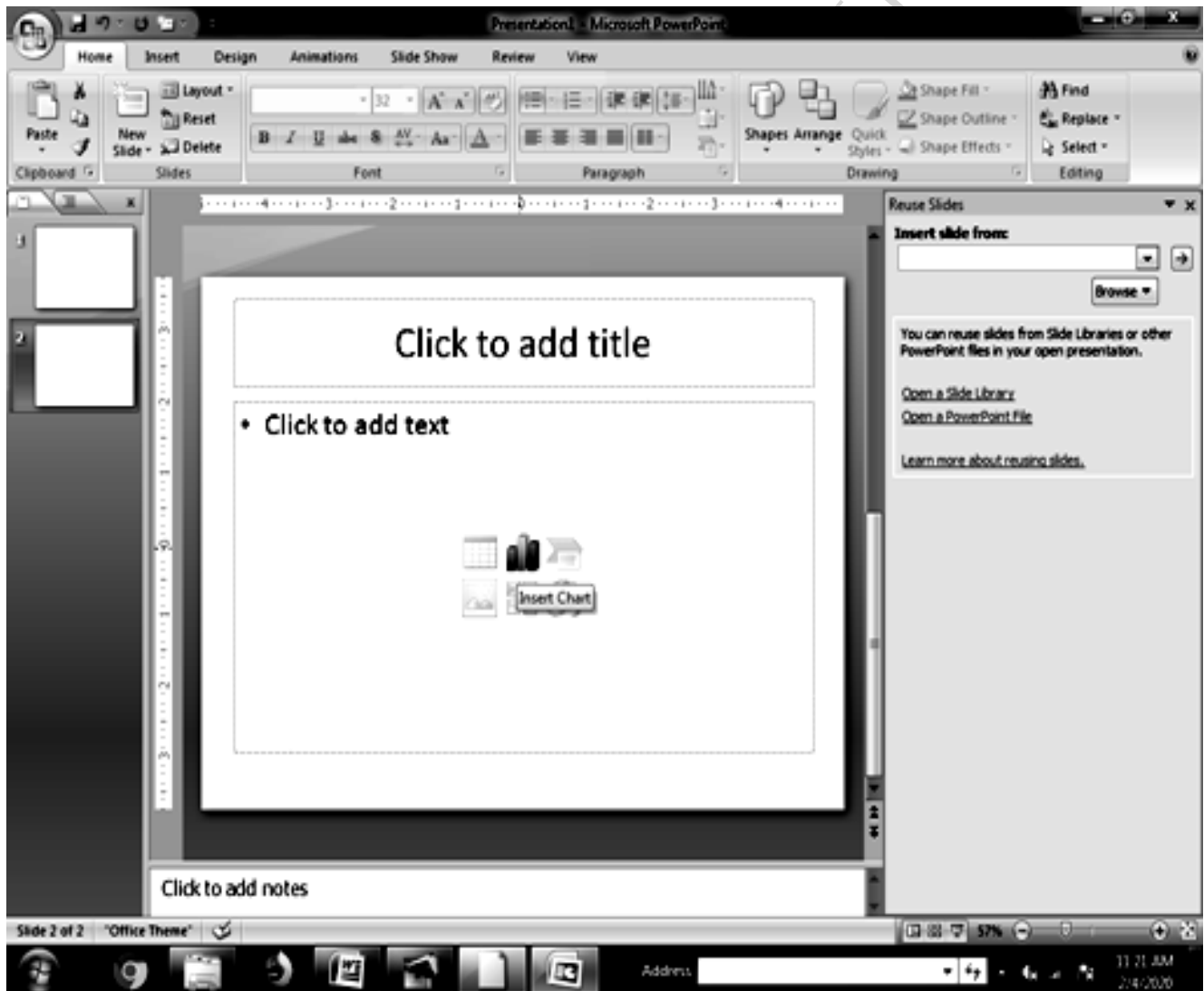
Once you have chosen a blank form for your new presentation, the first slide of your presentation appears. You can right click on the slide to choose the layout you want. There are nine different slide layouts from which to choose. You simply make your selection and click on it. Each choice described below, dictates how your completed slides will appear.

- ☞ **Title Slide :** This option is useful for beginning a presentation; use this slide if you want to include subtitles or smaller underneath a title.
- ☞ **Title and Content:** Anytime you need to make to list of things that fall underneath a general subject, choose this layout.
- ☞ **Section Header:** This is a useful option for putting different elements or text boxes.
- ☞ **Two Content:** This is useful option for putting different elements or text boxes.
- ☞ **Comparison :** This is a useful option for doing pro/con lists.
- ☞ **Title Only:** This option is great for the beginning of a presentation. No subtitles are included in this layout.
- ☞ **Blank:** Use this layout if you want a blank slide formatted according to the master Slide.
- ☞ **Content with caption:**
- ☞ **Picture with caption:** Use this option to place title over one linked object.

## ➤ **SELECTING THE CONTENT:-**

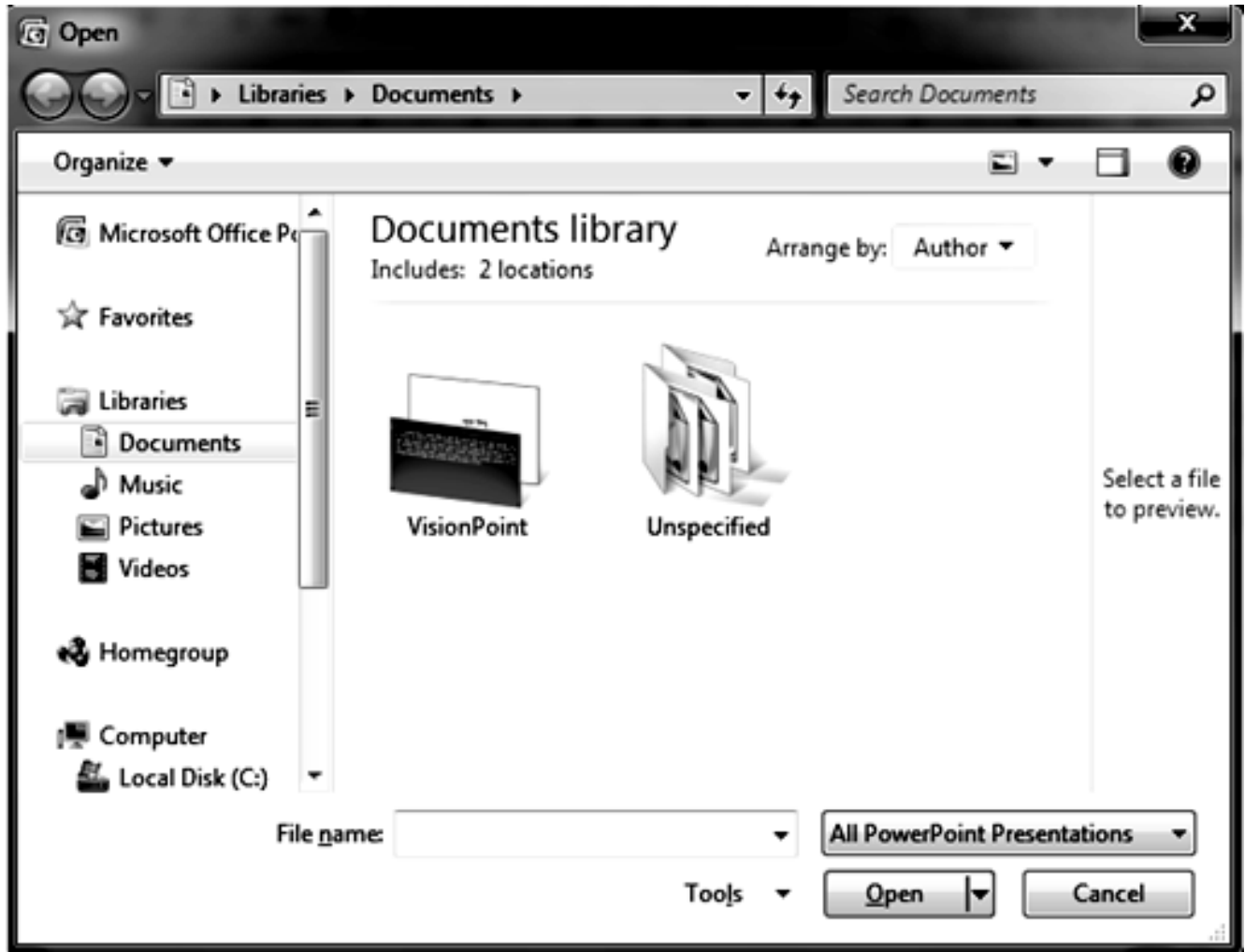
There are six types of elements shown inside the text box you can select from the contents within the slide.

- ☞ Insert table
- ☞ Insert chart
- ☞ Insert Smart Art Graphic
- ☞ Insert picture from file
- ☞ Insert Clip Art
- ☞ Insert Media Clip



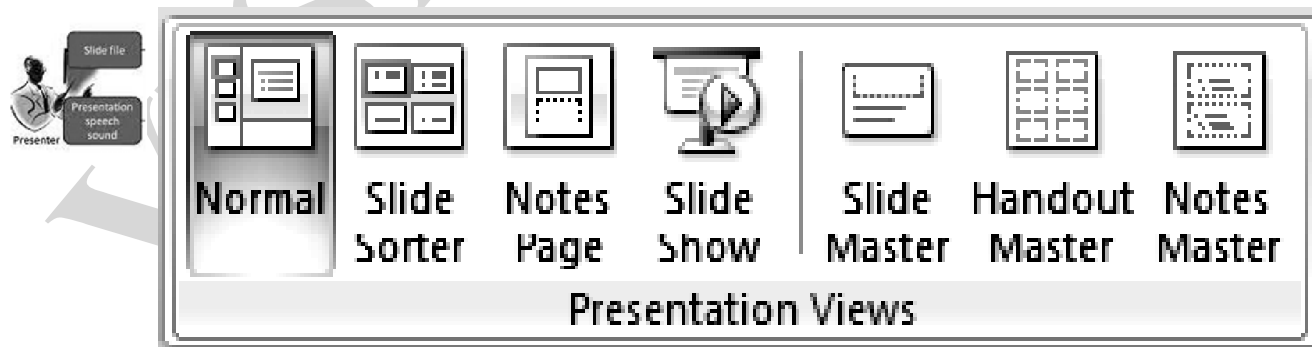
## ➤ **OPEN AN EXISTING PRESENTATION:-**

Select the Open tab from the Office button to open an existing presentation. Select the folder the file is located in from the Look in: drop-down menu and highlight the file on the list. Click Open to open the presentation.



## ➤ VIEW SLIDES

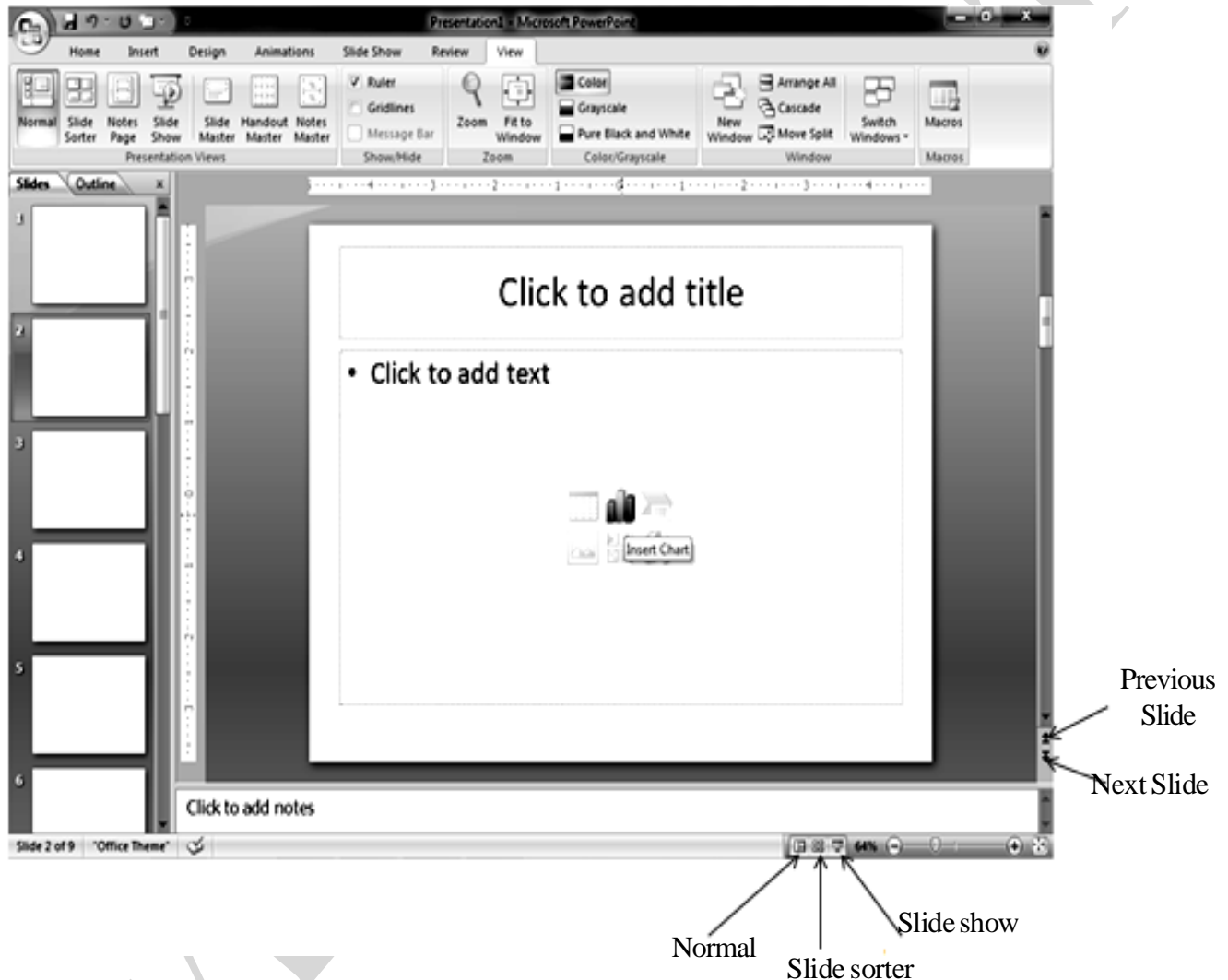
PowerPoint consists of multiple views to help you in the creation and presentation of your slides. These views are Normal, Slide Sorter, and Slide Show. The first two views are for creating your presentation and the last



one is for presentation of slide show. You can access these views by clicking the respective view buttons at the bottom right of the PowerPoint window. Or select the View and then the respective command on the menu bar. For example, if you want to choose Normal view, select **View** → **Normal** command on the menu bar.

## ➤ NORMAL VIEW:-

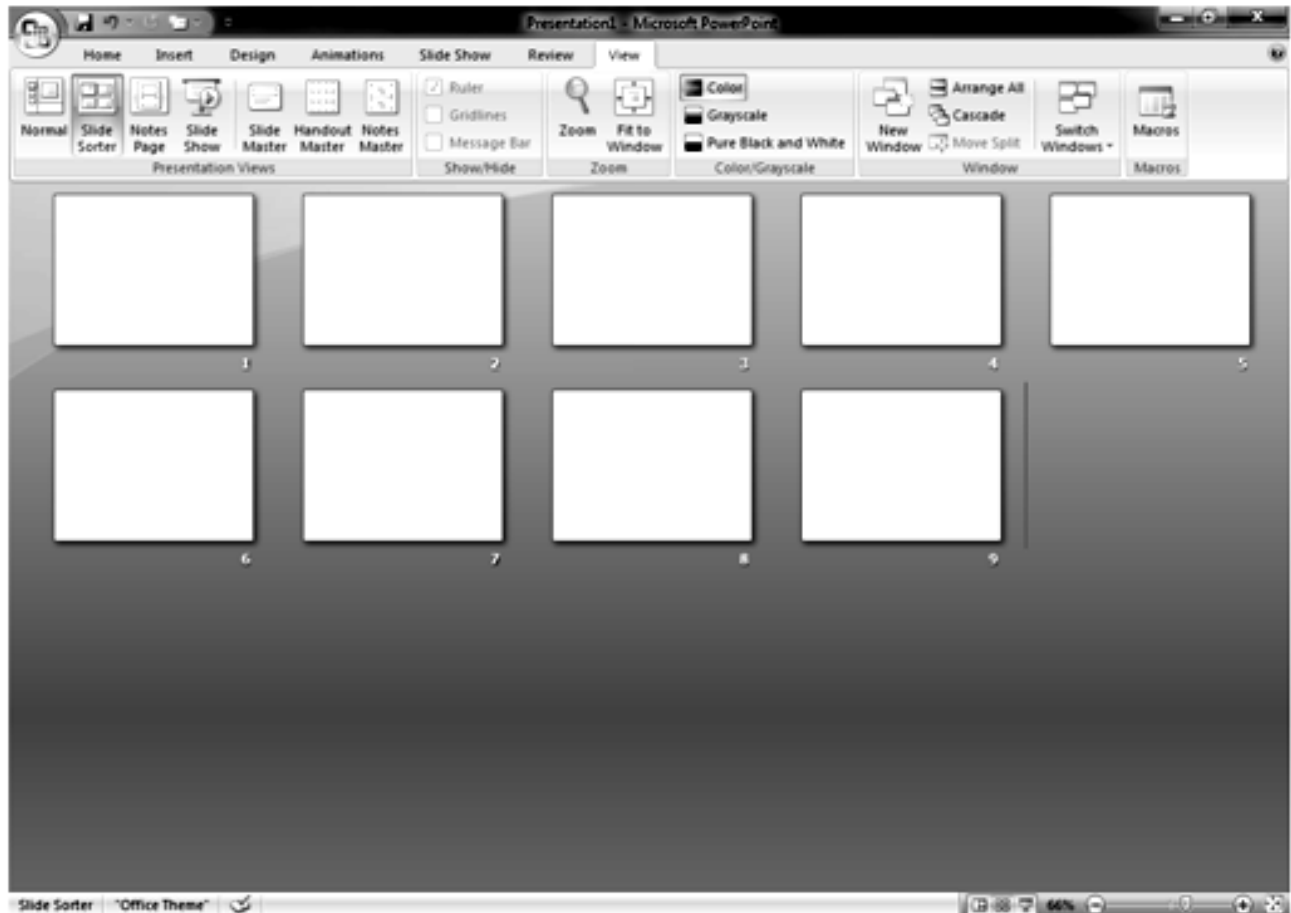
The Normal View divides the screen into three sections: the main window, where the current slide is displayed; the outline pane on the left; and the notes pane at the bottom. This is where you will do most of your work. You can resize each pane by clicking its border and dragging it to the size that you want it to be. To access Normal view, click on **Normal** view button at the bottom left of the window or select **View**→**Normal** command on the menu bar.



## ➤ SLIDE SORTER:-

A small image of each slide is displayed on Slide Sorter View. A Slides can easily be ordered and sorted using this view. You can also use this view to add special effect, such as the transactions that occur when each new slide appears. To access **Slide Sorter** view, click on Slide Sorter view button at the bottom left of the window or select **View** → **Slide Sorter** command on the menu bar.

To Switch To Slide Sorter View Click The Slide Sorter View Button Or Select View → Slide Sorter.

### ➤ DESIGN TIPS:-

Although, PowerPoint provides you with some very powerful tools to give excellent presentations, making the wrong design choices can defeat all your efforts. Making the right decisions is not difficult. By following the guidelines below, you can prepare best slides.

1. Use contrasting colours for the text and the background so the text will be easy to read.
2. Use font size large enough to be seen from the back of the room where the presentation will be held. A font size of 24-point or larger is recommended.
3. Use short phrases and sentences to convey your message.
4. Use simple slide transitions. Too many different transitions will distract your audience from the subject of the presentation.
5. Avoid cluttering the slides with too much text or graphics. Your audience should hear what you have to say and not be distracted by a busy screen.
6. Keep text simple and easy to read by not using many different text effects such as **bold**, *italic*, underlining, larger font size for emphasis within a sentence, or a different font all on the same slide.

### ➤ WORKING WITH SLIDES

Slides are the building blocks of your presentation. You can also create or use layouts and designs, add notes and create handouts, and customize the look of your slides. You can create new slides by

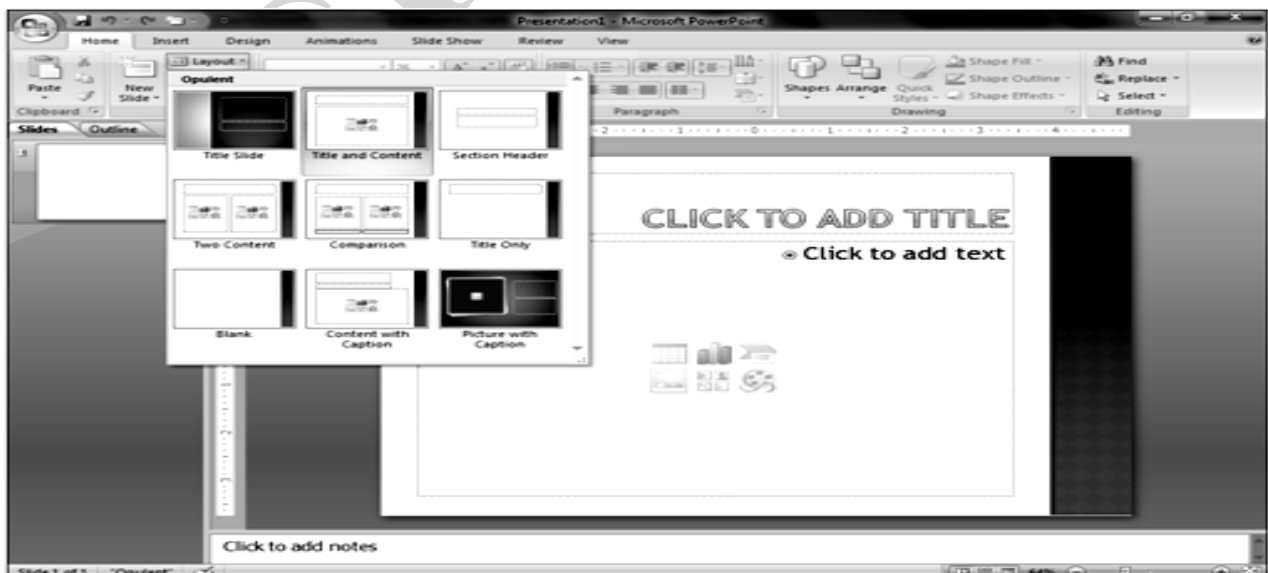
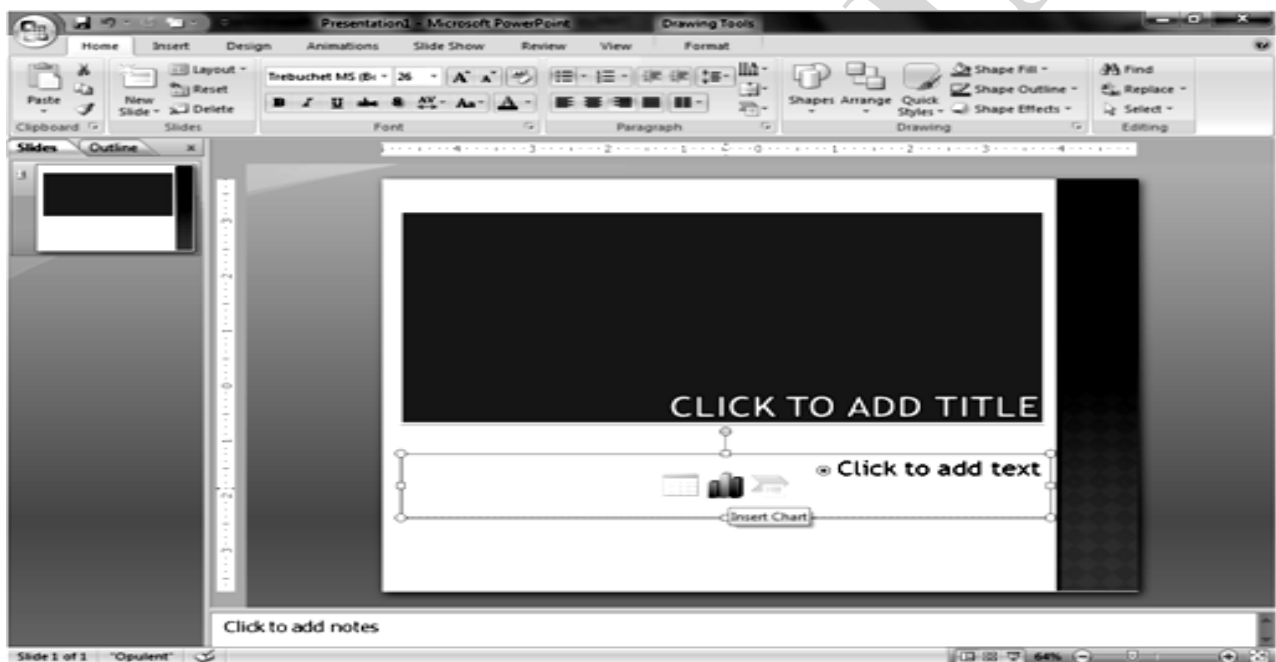
inserting them into your show. When you create new slide, you can use any of the nine layouts available in the New Slide dialog box or choose a blank slide. Once you have created a new slide, you can insert various elements such as text, pictures, graphs, tables etc.

### ➤ APPLYING A DESIGN TEMPLATE

To add a design template or change the existing one, select Design tag on the Ribbon. Select the template by clicking on it.

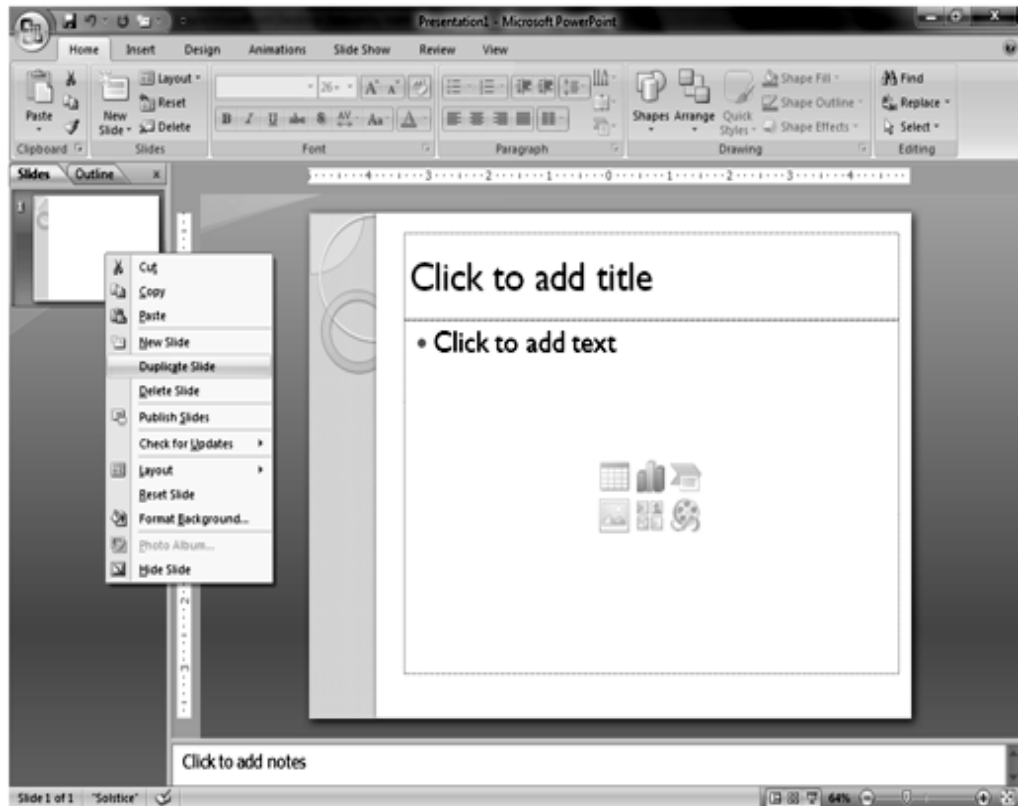
### ➤ CHANGING SLIDE LAYOUTS

To change the layout template of the slide select **Home** → **Layout** command on the menu bar. The Slide Layout dialog box appears with nine layouts. Click on one of the layout thumbnail images to apply.



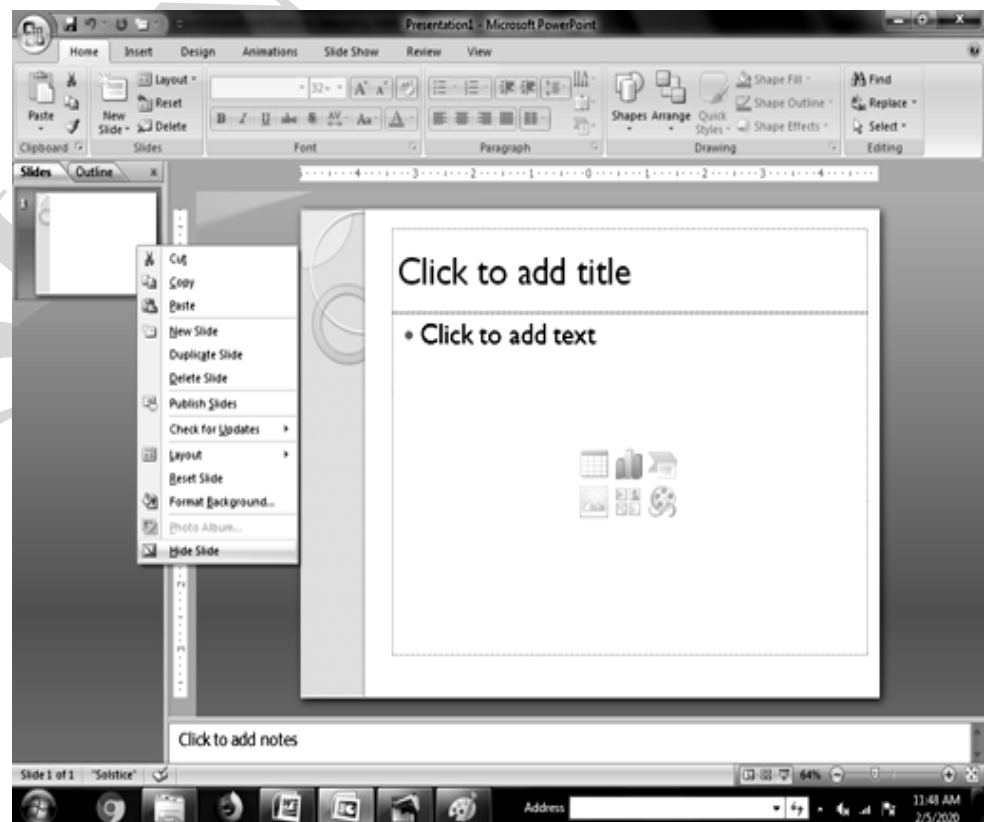
### ➤ **DUPLICATE SELECTED SLIDES:-**

Duplicate Selected Slides gives you a duplicate of a slide when you need to create similar slides. To insert a copy of the current slide after the current slide, choose the slide you want to duplicate, and then Right Click for the **Duplicate Slide Command** on the menu bar or press **CTRL+SHIFT+D** Keys. You can also cut/and paste slide by selecting the whole slide.



### ➤ **HIDE SLIDES:-**

If you do not want a slide to appear during the slide show, but do not want to delete the slide as it may be used later, the slide can be hidden by right clicking on the slide in the slide pane and selecting **Hide**. You can unhide a hidden slide in a similar manner.

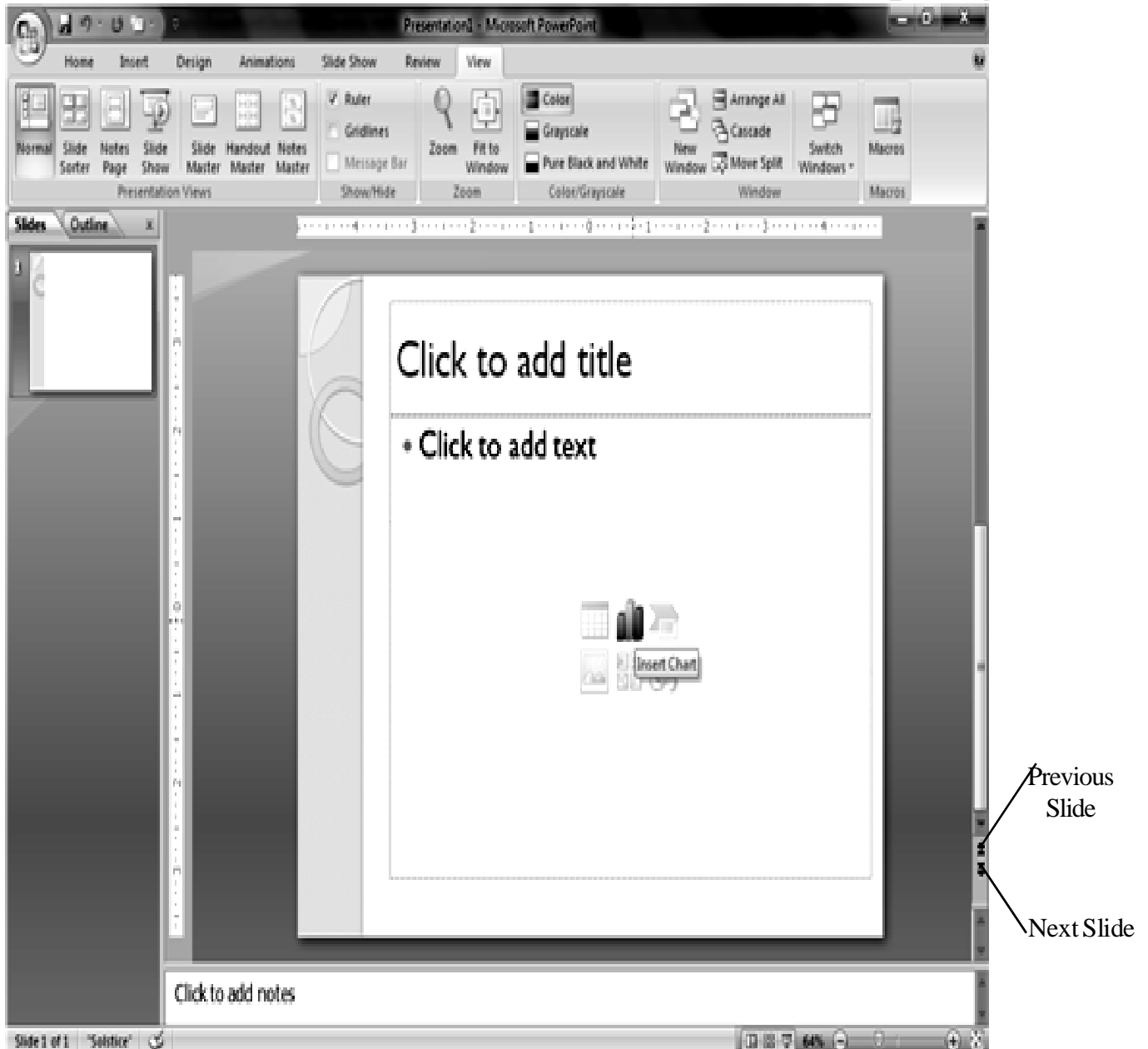


## ➤ MOVING BETWEEN SLIDES:-

You can move from one slide to another slide by using the following tools.

**Scroll Bars:-** Use the Scroll Bars to move from one slide to another slide or through the text that is displayed in the notes pane and the outline pane.

**Next Slide and Previous Slide Buttons:-** The **Next Slide** and Previous Slide buttons move you to the **next slide** or previous slide in a slide show. These buttons, indicated by a double-arrow, are located at the bottom of the vertical scroll bar.



**Using Outline Pane:-** Change to Outline view and then click on the slide that you want to view. You can move around in the outline pane by using your mouse, or by using up and down arrow keys.



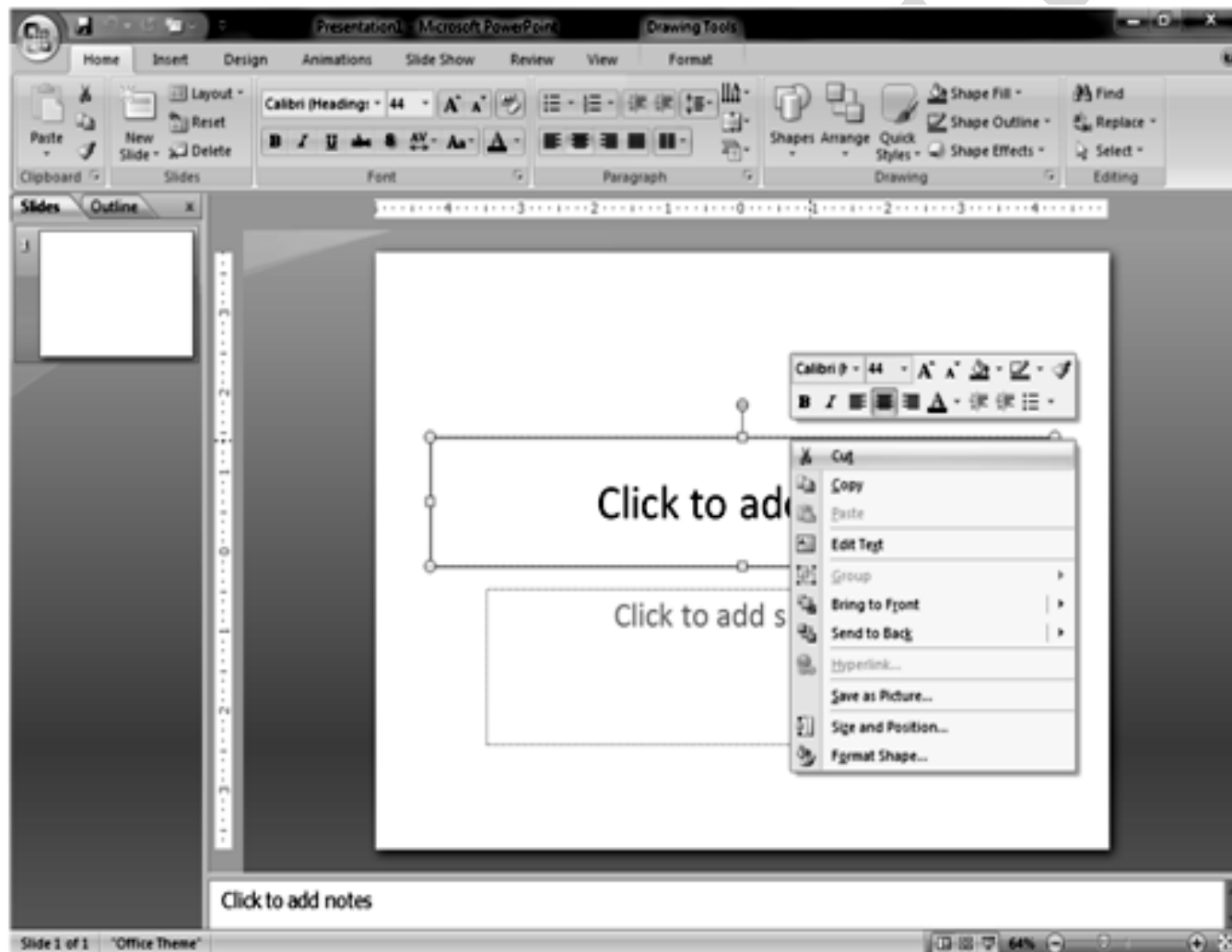
## WORKING WITH TEXT

You can work with text to communicate your ideas to your audience. PowerPoint gives you several ways to insert, edit and format text for your presentations.

### Inserting Text

You can insert by using the outlining or inserting text boxes.

- Outline Text :** The outline text can be used to create slides of a similar nature. By using the Outlines toolbar, you can create heads, lists and paragraphs. PowerPoint uses the format of your outline to correctly insert text in a slide. Heading 1 becomes the title of a slide, heading 2 becomes the first line of the text



box, and so on. When you select a predefined layout and switch over to Outline view as explained earlier, you can see the Outline text options on the left side window. To choose Outlining toolbar, select the Outline pane next to the slide pane on left side below the menu bar.

- Text Box :** The text boxes are the way that PowerPoint puts text on a slide. When you create a slide, and use a specific slide layout, the slide will have one or more text boxes in it. Simply click on the existing text to add new text.

If you want to add a new text box to the slide, select **Insert** → **Text Box** command on the menu bar and then draw the text box with the mouse at a place where you want to insert the text box.

**If you want to resize a text box, follow the steps given below:**

- ☞ Select the text box you wish to resize by clicking on it with the mouse. A border with eight handles will appear around the text box. The four handles on the corners will resize the length and width of the box at once while the handles on the sides will resize only in one direction.
- ☞ Click one of the handles as per your requirement and drag it with the mouse. Release the mouse button when it is the size you want to be. Move the text box by clicking and dragging the thick dotted border with the mouse.

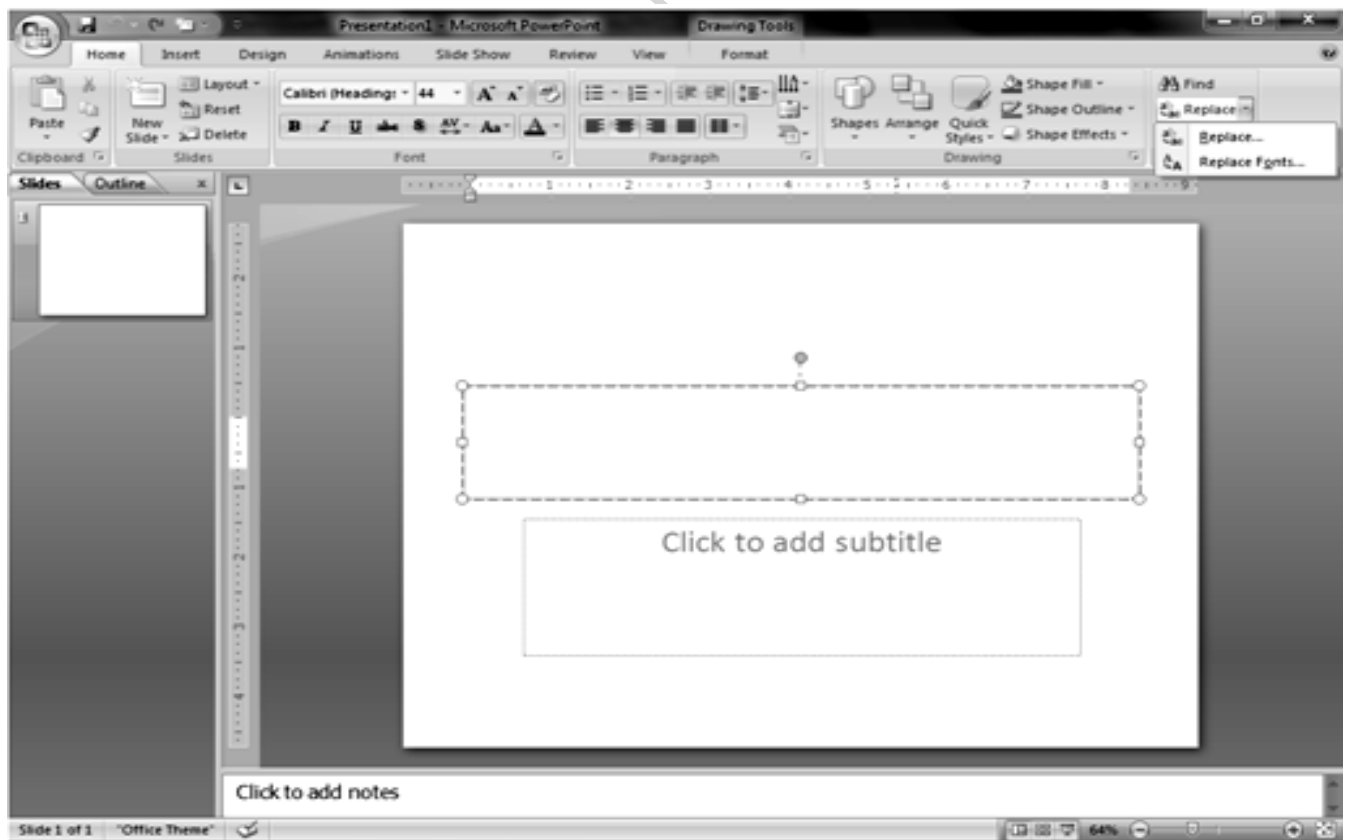
### ☞ **FORMATTING TEXT:-**

**Format Fonts :-** Select the text that will be formatted by highlighting the text either on the outline or on the slide. You can select from **Home** → **Font** menu bar or right click on the highlighted selection and select the **Font** menu from the popup shortcut menu. Select a font size, style, effect and colour from the **Font** dialog box.

**Line Spacing :-** Change the amount of space between lines in a text box by selecting Home Line Spacing from the Paragraph menu bar.

- **Line Spacing** - Select the amount of vertical space between lines. A value of “1” is equal to single spacing and “2” is double spacing. Value between and above these numbers are valid as well.

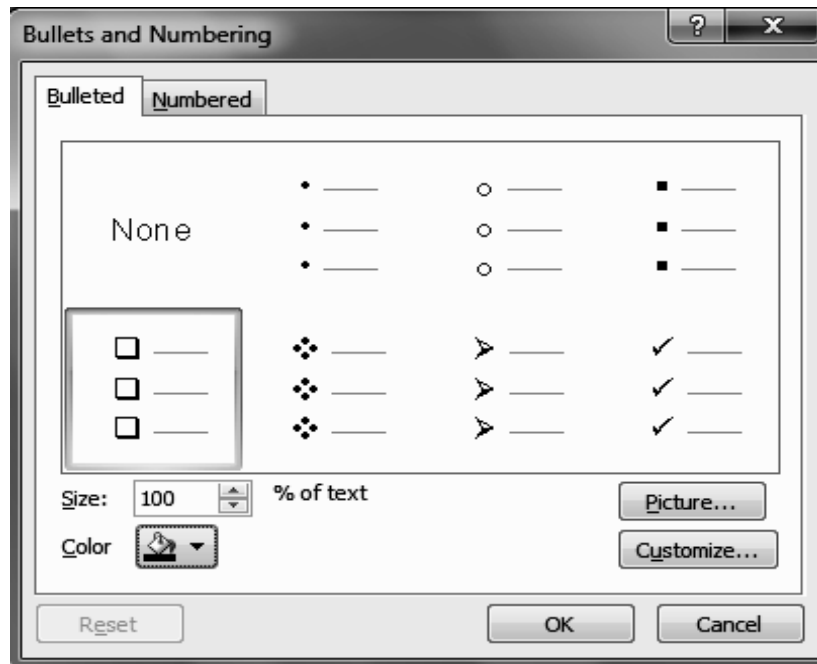
**Replace Font:-** Design templates have a preset font that you may want to change or you want to change the font used on for the entire presentation for a number of reasons. This can be accomplished quickly using the



Replace Fonts feature. Select **Home** → **Replace** → **Replace Fonts** from the menu bar. Choose the

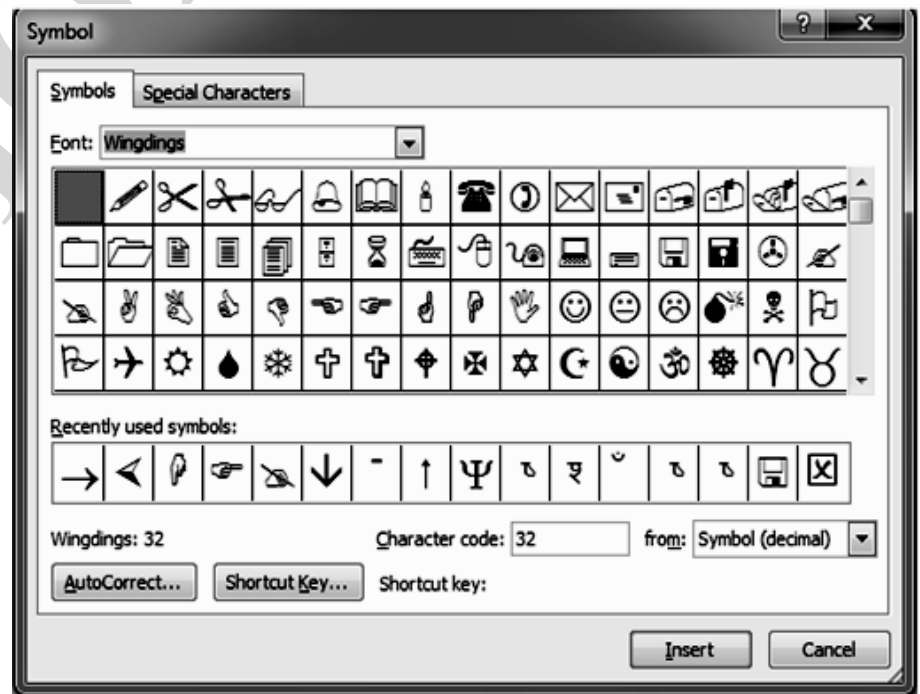
font you want to **Replace** from the first drop-down menu and the font it should be replaced **with** from the second menu, and click the Replace button.

- ☞ **BULLETS LISTS ON DESIGN TEMPLATES:-** Bulleted lists allow you to clearly display the main points of your presentation on slides. The text boxes on design templates already include bulleted lists. Click the placeholder on the slide to begin adding text and press the **ENTER** key to return to the next line and add a few bulleted items. To go to the next line without adding another bullet, hold down the **SHIFT** key while pressing **ENTER**.

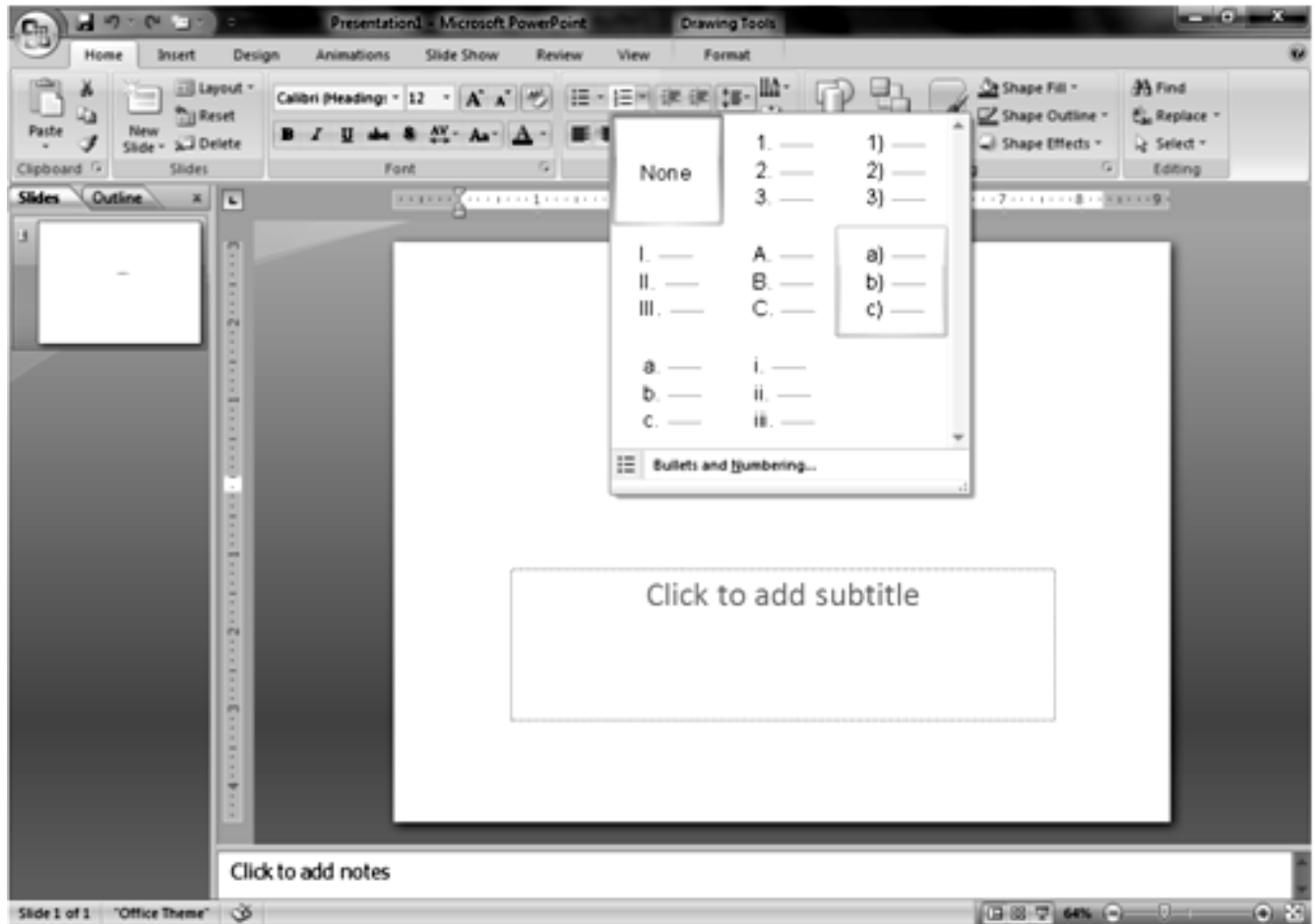


1. In slide view, create a text box by selecting **Insert** → **Text Box** from the menu bar.
2. “Draw” the text box on the slide by holding down the left mouse button while you move the mouse until the box is the size you want it.
3. Choose the **Bullets** or **Numbering** from the Home → Paragraph menu bar.
4. Change the size of the bullet by changing the percentage in relation to the text.
5. Choose a colour for the bullet from the **Colour** menu. Click **More Colours** for a larger selection.
6. Select one of the bullet types shown and **click OK**. Or click the **Picture** button to

view the **Picture** Bullet window. Select one of the bullets and click **OK**. Or click the character button to select any character from the fonts on the computer. Select a symbol font such as Wingdings or Webdings from the **Bullets from** drop-down menu for the best selection of icons. Click on the characters in the grid to see them larger. Click **OK** when you have chosen the bullet you want to use.

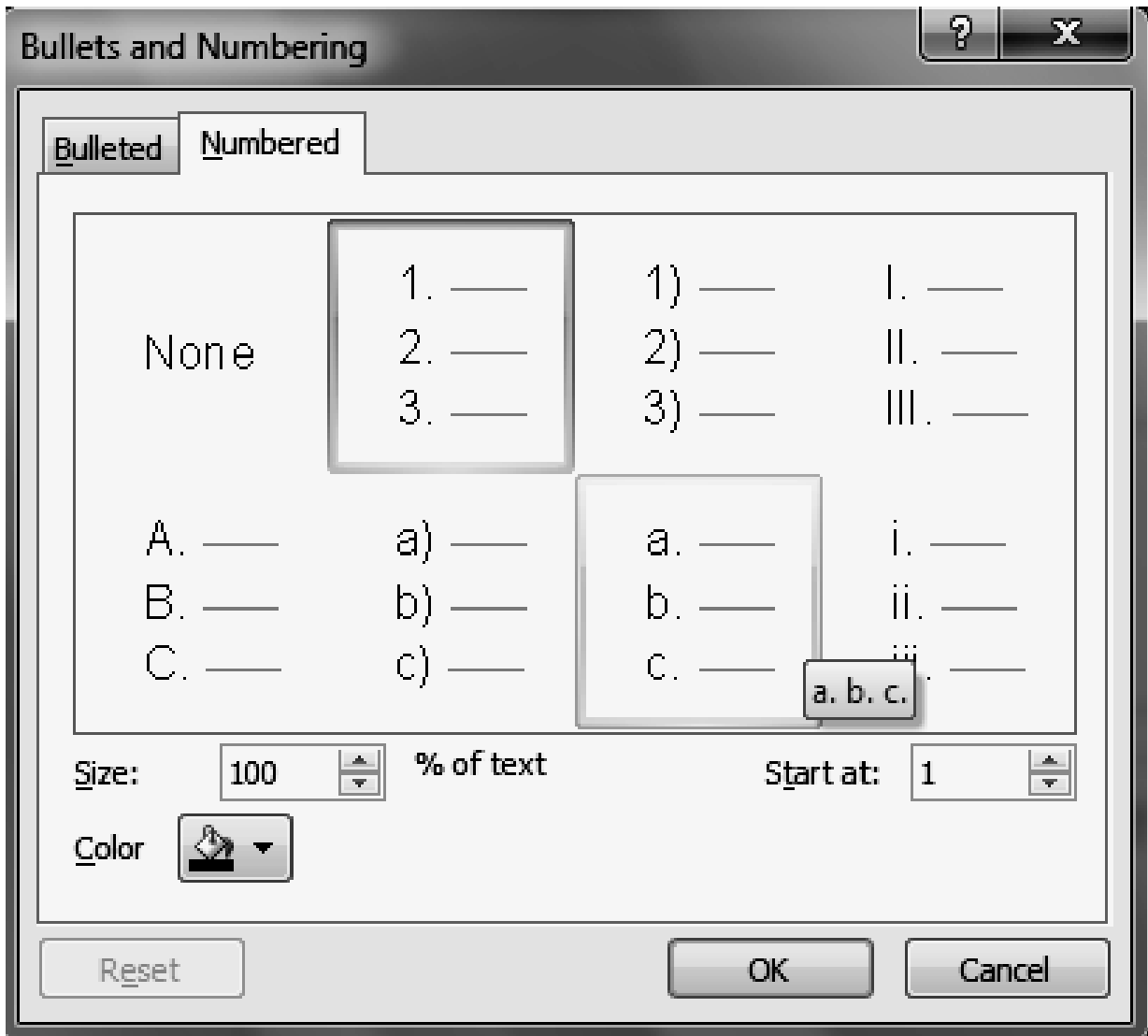


- ☞ **BULLETED LIST AND NEW SLIDES FROM AN OUTLINE :-** In Normal or Outline view, text can easily be entered in the outline window and new slides are automatically added. Follow the steps below to become familiar with adding slide content in Outline view:



- ☞ Next to the **Slide 1** icons, type the title of the slide. The text you type beside the slide icons will be the large-type titles on each slide.
- ☞ Press **ENTER** key to type the next line. This will automatically create a new slide. To create a bulleted list for the first slide, press the **TAB** key or **ALT+SHIFT+RIGHT** Arrow keys to demote the selection to a bulleted list item.
- ☞ Continue entering text for the bulleted list, pressing **ENTER** key at the end of each line to create a new bullet.
- ☞ Create a multilevel list by executing the above action again to create a bulleted sublist. Press **ALT+SHIFT+Left Arrow** keys to return to the original list.
- ☞ Continue creating new slides and bulleted lists by using the above actions until the presentation is completed. Use the formatting instructions below to format the lists.

If there is more than one bulleted list on the slide, the lists will be designated by numbers enclosed in black boxes. The example below shows the slide created from the outline on the left. The bulleted list on the left slide of

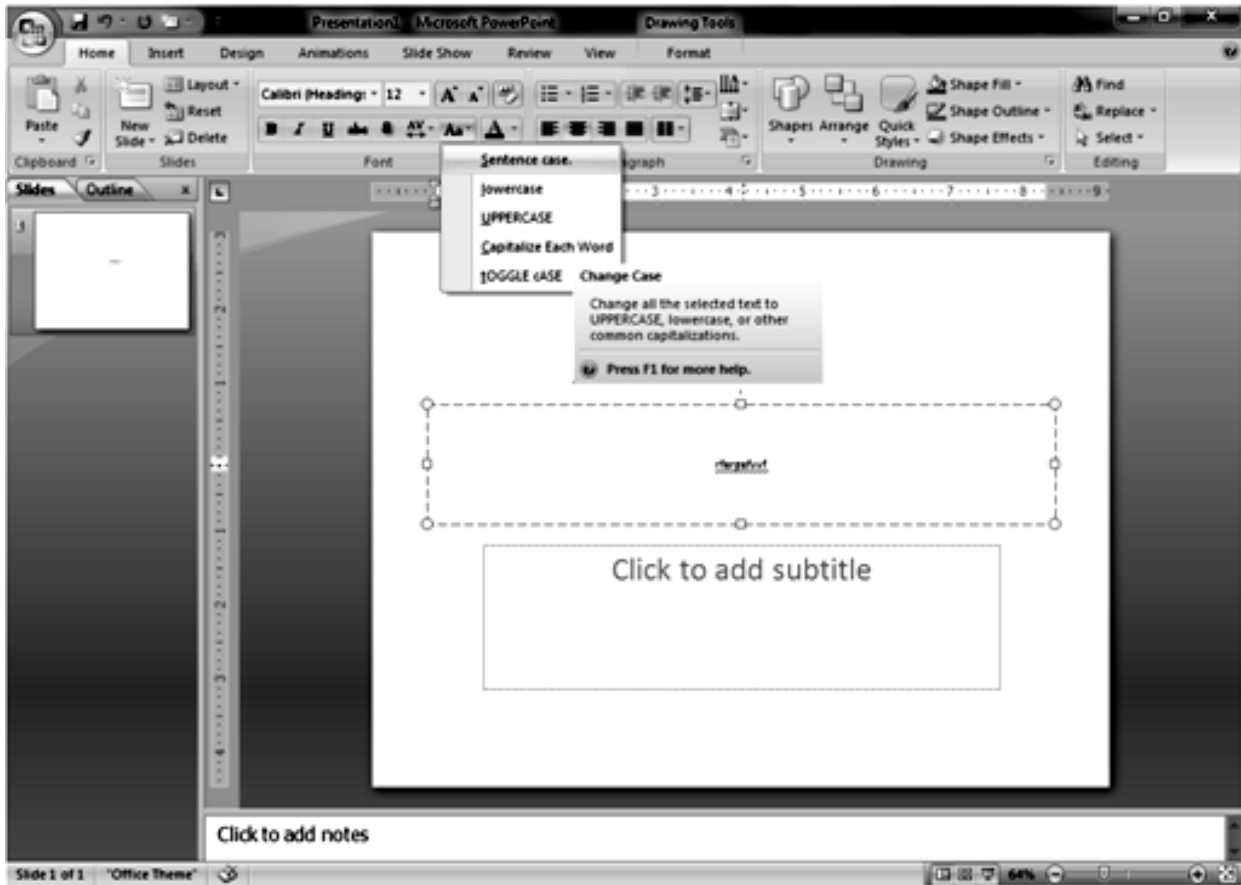


the slide is labeled list “1” on the outline and the list on the right is labeled list “2”. When typing the outline, begin typing in the new list by pressing **CTRL+ENTER** keys.

Numbered List : Follow these step to create a numbered list :

- ☞ Create a text box.
- ☞ With the text box selected, choose **Home Paragraph** → **Numbering** from the menu bar.
- ☞ Click the **Numbered** tab at the top of the Bullets and Numbering window.
- ☞ Change the size of the numbers by changing the percentage in relation to the text.
- ☞ Choose a colour for the numbers from the **Colour** menu. Click **More Colours** for a larger selection.
- ☞ Change the **Start at** value if the numbers should not begin with 1.
- ☞ Select one of the sevel list types shown and click **OK**.

➤ **CHANGE CASE :-** Change the case of the characters in a paragaph by selecting Home Change Case from the Font menu bar without having to retype the text.



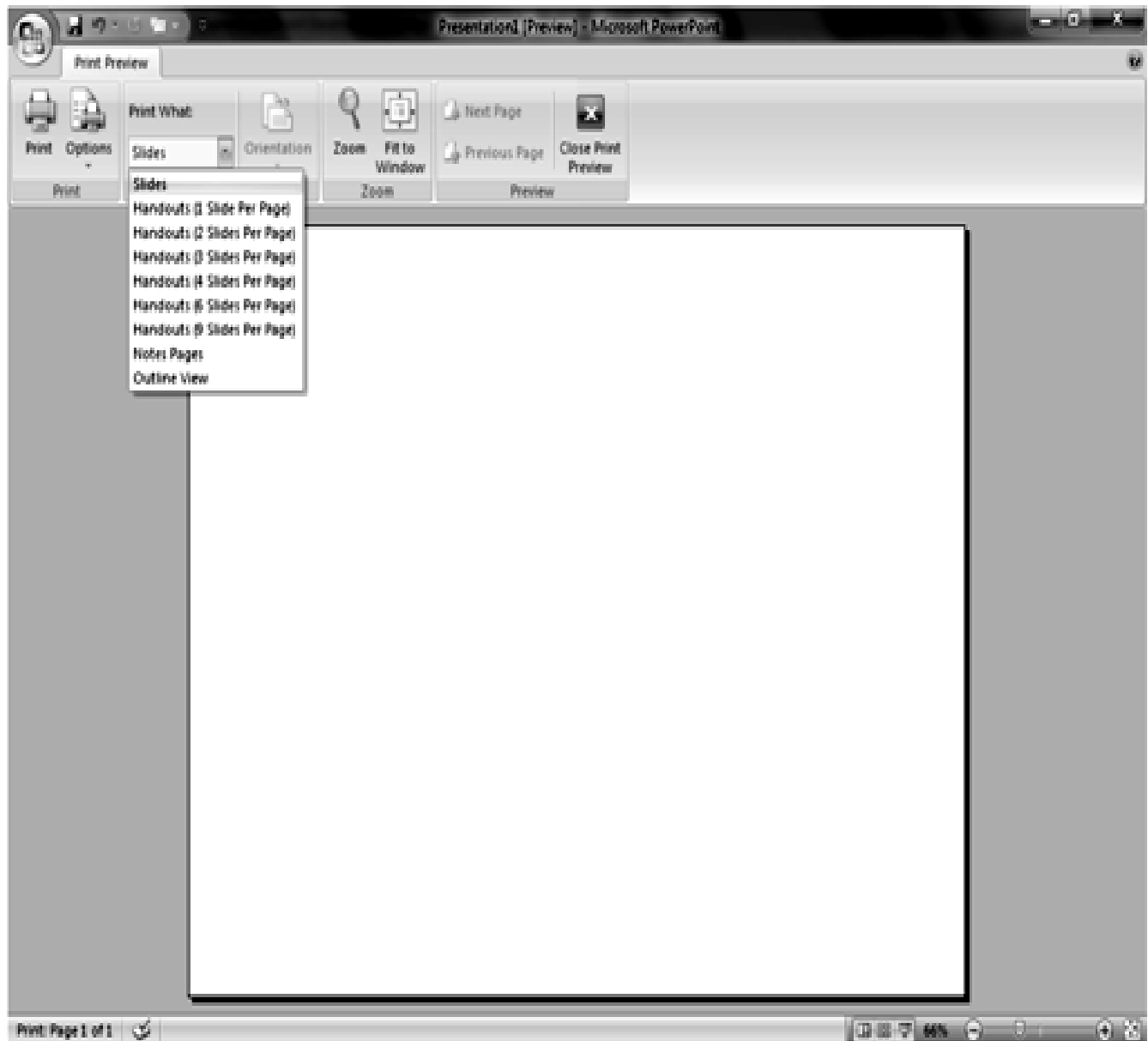
- ☞ **Sentence case** - Capitalizes the first letter of the first word in each sentence.
- ☞ **Lowercase and Uppercase** - Changes the case of all the letters.
- ☞ **Title case** - Capitalizes the first letter of every word and reduces the rest to lowercase.
- ☞ **Toggle case** - The opposite of Title case, it makes the first letter of every word lowercase and capitalizes the remaining letter.

## ➤ SAVING AND PRINTING

You can save your presentation slide as a file in a folder. You can also save the slides as Web page so that you can post them on Internet. Printing is similar to what you have done in Word and Excel. Remember to set up your page before saving or printing your presentation slides.



☞ **PAGE SETUP:-** Select **Office button** → **Print Preview** from the menu bar to access options for printing the presentation slides. Select the format the printed slides will be used for from the slides drop-down menu.



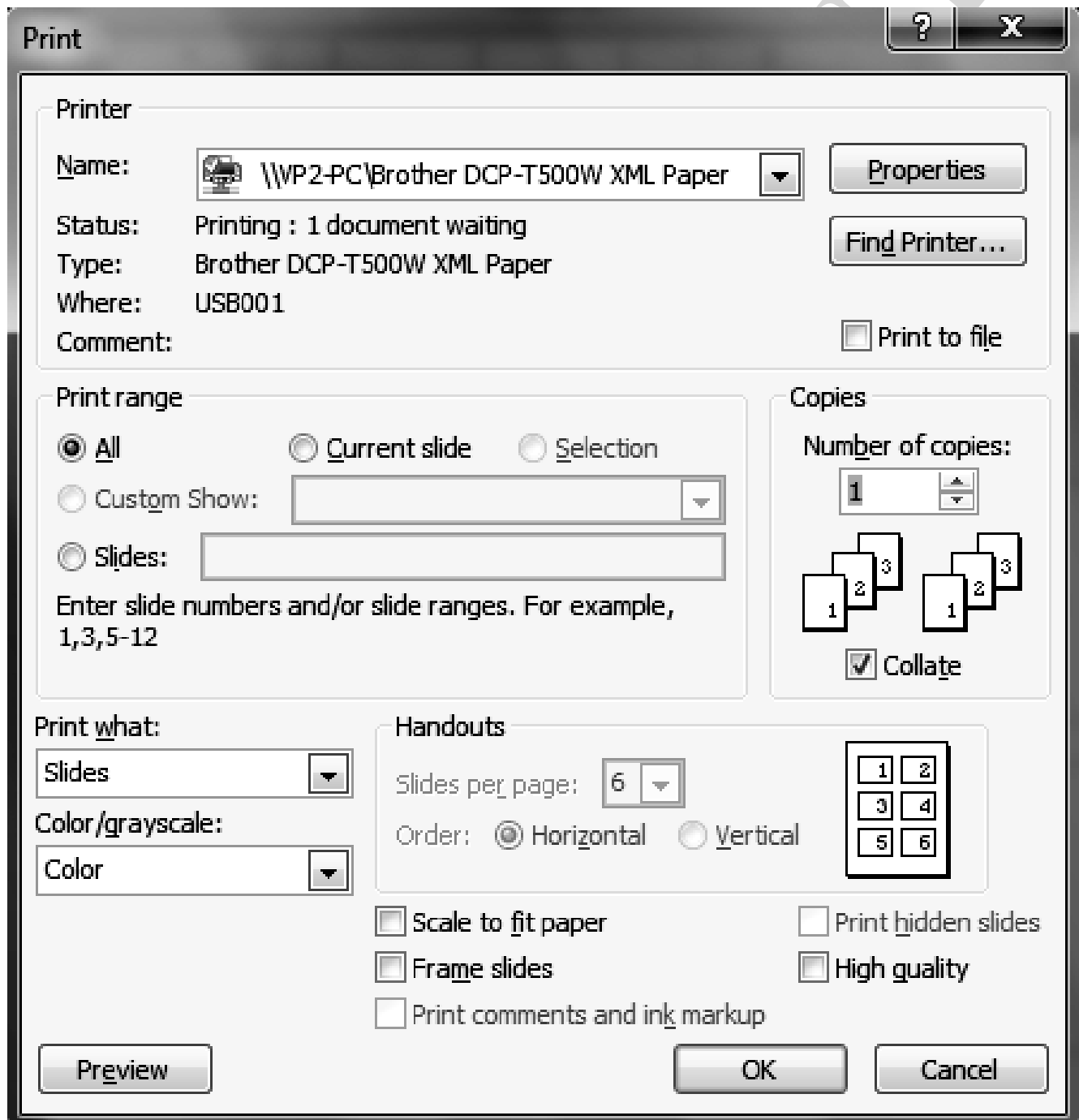
**PRINT** - Select **Office button** → **Print** command on the menu bar to print the presentation. The Print dialog box appears. Choose the following options in the Print box.

**Print Range** - Select **All** to print all the slides in the presentation, **Current slide** to print only the **current slide**, or enter slide numbers in the **Slides** field to print only certain slides.

**COPIES** - Enter the number of copies of each **slide** specified in Print range and check the **Collate** box if necessary.

**PRINT WHAT :-**

- ✗ **Slides** - Prints a full-page slide on each page.
- ✗ **Handouts** - Prints as many slides as you designate on each page.
- ✗ **Notes Page** - Prints one slide with that slide's notes on each page.
- ✗ **Outline view** - Prints the outline of the presentation **Click OK to PRINT.**





## ➤ CLOSE A DOCUMENT

To close the current presentation slides file, select **Office button** → **Close** Command on the menu bar. If the file contains any unsaved changes, you will be prompted to save the file before closing.

## ➤ EXIT POWERPOINT PROGRAM

When finished your work in PowerPoint and closed all the files, you can quite the PowerPoint program by selecting **Office button** → **Exit PowerPoint** command on the menu bar.



➤ **KEYBOARD SHORTCUTS:-** Keyboard shortcuts can save time and the effort of switching from the keyboard to the mouse to execute simple commands. Print this list of PowerPoint keyboard shortcuts and keep it by your computer for a quick reference.
